Parish Council

The latest meeting of the Parish Council took place on Thursday 13th July. Councillors Thorne, Edwards, Barter, Tatner and Rigg were present, together with the Parish Clerk. Apologies had been received from Cllrs Smith and Williams. Wiltshire Councillor Nabil Najjar and one member of the public were also present. The full minutes of the meeting, together with the papers considered, are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk).

It was reported that Wiltshire Council Drainage Engineers are continuing to examine what can be done to prevent flooding in Faulston Lane. They have now decided to replace the existing culvert under the road, which connects the ditch on the south side with that which runs north towards the river, with a larger diameter pipe. This project is programmed for September and will require the closure of Faulston Lane for five days. [The precise dates will be publicised on the village WhatsApp Network as soon as they are known].

Councillor Najjar drew attention to the Wiltshire Local Plan review. Full Council would be considering the outcome of the review at its meeting on 18th July. The plan sets out how the housing requirements of the county will be met for the period up to 2036. Most new development will be in the main settlements, such as Salisbury. In the rural areas new housing will be limited to what is required to meet local needs and will be based on assessments requested by Parish Councils.

Councillor Najjar was asked to take up the matter of the management of road closures in the village (see Parish Council report in June's STaB). A further closure of Broad Chalke Road between the Butt Lane and Flamstone Street junctions, for works by Openreach, will take place on 22nd August. It was likely that traffic will ignore the long official diversion route and try to use Butt Lane/The Alley and Flamstone Street in the same way as recently occurred in Mill Lane and Faulston Lane, with resulting traffic chaos. The matter had been taken up with Wiltshire Council officials but their response had not been reassuring. It was pointed out that the works proposed by Openreach (the replacement of overhead line poles) could be managed with stop/go boards or traffic lights thus keeping the main road open. Cllr Najjar undertook to speak to officers about this.

Consideration was given to a pre-circulated paper on speed limits along the Broad Chalke Road (the paper is available on the village website). The Clerk said that a meeting had taken place with Wiltshire's Director of Highways and the Strategic Planning Officer of the Police and Crime Commissioner, together with the Clerk from Broad Chalke Council, to discuss concerns about speeding along the length of the C12. It was likely that Wiltshire would be undertaking a road safety review along the whole corridor in due course, but it had been indicated that there might be scope for one or two minor improvements in the interim. Broad Chalke's top priority is the entrance to the village from the east, where the speed limit goes from

60mph to 20mph in one jump. They want a "step down" limit of 30mph before the 20mph section is reached. It was agreed that Bishopstone Council's priorities are a reduction from 40mph to 30mph in the speed limit on the section of the road past the Recreation Field, Children's Play Area and the pub, and the extension of the 40mph limit past the junction with Flamstone Street.

The reduced speed limit in Bishopstone had been rejected by Wiltshire Council in the past and there was no certainty that any application to that effect would succeed now. However, it was considered that it is worth a further try, given the strong support from Cllr Najjar. The matter would be considered initially by Wiltshire Council's Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group (part of the Area Board). It was agreed to submit a joint request with Broad Chalke Council (which had agreed a reciprocal proposal at its July meeting). If taken forward the next step would be an assessment by consultants. Both Bishopstone and Broad Chalke Councils would need to contribute to the cost. If the proposals pass that hurdle they could form part of the programme for 2024/25 but inclusion then would depend on other priorities.

Cllr Edwards drew attention to increasing incidence of dogs being taken on to the Recreation Field. A notice on the gate by the Children's Play Area indicating that use of the field by dogs was not permitted was being ignored both by people from within the village and by passing visitors. It was important to prevent fouling of the Play Area and the wider field. It was agreed to improve the signage and to include a reminder message in STaB.

Cllr Tatner raised the problems being caused by the reduced maintenance of roadside verges by Wiltshire Council. Bus drivers were missing people standing at the bus stop opposite Pitts Lane because they could not see them as they approached. Other problems included visibility at the junctions of Flamstone Street and Whitlock Rise. It was agreed to take the matter up with Wiltshire Highways.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on **Thursday 7**th **September 2023** (note one week earlier than normal) at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.



REMINDER

Dogs are not allowed in Bishopstone's Children's Play Area or on the rest of the Recreation Field.

We are very lucky in Bishopstone to have a wealth of beautiful tracks and footpaths where dogs can be exercised. Taking a dog onto the Recreation Field is antisocial and, even if you clear up after them, poses a health risk for other users, particularly young children.

This year for one afternoon only, the Sports Centre Committee has relaxed its rules on dogs on the grounds. All well behaved dogs ...and owners...welcome. Why not have a go on the dog agility course...it's just for fun and to raise money for Chalke Valley Good Causes. Dog facilities will be available.

At the AGM in June, it was agreed that replacement of the artificial cricket wicket is one of the priorities at the end of this season and the Sports Centre Committee is working with the Cricket Club to raise funds. It is anticipated that costs for the work will be in the region of £5,000. If you would like to donate towards the project, please contact either David Cooper or Chris Rothwell.

Also agreed at the AGM was starting to plan replacement of the Table Tennis Club's tables and starting the process of what action is best to refurbish the Multi Use Sports Area in the next 12-24 months. This cost could be £30,000-£40,000 for which the Committee has been preparing for over recent years with funds being set aside in deposit account as matched funding towards grant applications.

These projects are in addition to the daily work managing the centre and keeping it maintained and open. With costs ever increasing, the Committee has agreed to raise the Membership fees from the current £37/year to £40/year and, for the first time, to introduce a junior membership fee of £11/yr. From 1 September 2023.

Activities for children have always formed a large part of the Festival, but this year the new and improved Knight School proved to be a real winner with the Pendlenton boys! Priced at £20 per child it was perhaps on the expensive side, but this bought them access to 4 different activities: firing weapons such as the trebuchet, archery, jousting (on a model horse I hasten to add!) and sword fighting.

The re-enacters running these activities were brilliant, and their enthusiasm was infectious. We did this early in the day which meant there were no queues.

After Knight School we were just in time to watch the real jousting, which took place twice a day at the weekend. It was a nail-biting sight, particularly as a knight was knocked off his horse during the first clash of the day. Thankfully the armour did its job and said knight staggered to his feet to ride again. We missed the traditional fairground that is usually at the Festival, but the jousting was a brilliant addition to the programme.















The rest of the day was spent wandering around the site enjoying the free events and lively, sociable atmosphere.

We loved watching the Acrochaps who would launch into hilarious repartee alongside their spectacular acrobatic displays.

Wizzo's Rip-Roaring Histories was also fantastic entertainment (he is one half of the 'History Tellers' who are Festival regulars). The entire family were gripped by his amusing prop-filled talk about the Dambusters.

As ever, there was a huge choice of places to eat and drink. This is perfect when you go as a family because all tastes, including those of fussy youngsters, can be catered for.

Robert and I juggled childcare duties so we could both attend talks. This year there were fewer paid talks in the large tents (and those in the tents were cheaper than in previous years) and more that were accessible to all who had paid for daily Festival entry. The restructuring of the pricing system will no doubt have been popular with those who want to attend lots of talks, but I know that those who were offput by the big jump in entrance fees, particularly families with young children who can't easily spend time watching talks. It will be interesting to see whether the CVHF team choose to adjust their pricing next summer.

Whatever the prices, we all had a fantastic - and thankfully sunny - day. We are lucky to have such a great event in our valley. Long may it continue.

Notes from a Nutritionist

My recipe this month is an adaptation of one of my favourite recipes from a book called 'Stirring Slowly' by a writer called Georgina Hayden. It uses chicken legs or chicken thighs which are cooked in a sticky, slightly spicy plum sauce.

Plums are now in season and are a fruit that contain over 15 different vitamins such as vitamins A and C, as well as being rich in fibre. They are also great for supporting digestion and have nutrients in them that can help to control your blood sugar.

As I described in my May newsletter, chicken thighs or drumsticks are an excellent source of essential vitamins and minerals including iron, zinc and B vitamins. They have a slightly higher fat content than chicken breasts, but I feel that their nutritional benefit outweighs this. If however you would prefer to use breast meat for this recipe, then use one medium-sized chicken breast per person and reduce cooking time by 5 minutes to prevent the chicken from drying out.

Chilli peppers are a member of the nightshade family that includes bell peppers and tomatoes. Capsaicin is the compound responsible for their 'hot, burning' taste but also for their ability to reducing appetite and increase the body's ability to burn fat. Chilli peppers are also very high in antioxidant compounds that have numerous health benefits around the body including helping the body to fight colds and flu, reducing joint pain and supporting cardiovascular health.

Cinnamon is a versatile spice that has been prized for its medicinal properties for thousands of years, and modern scientific research now confirms its potential health benefits. These include cinnamon's anti-inflammatory properties, its ability to improve your sensitivity to the hormone insulin which helps to improve blood sugar control, and its powerful antioxidant content that can help to protect your body from damage caused by toxins. Adding a daily teaspoon of cinnamon to your meals is a great way to support good health.

Finally, I've recently become a fan of the pouches of pre-cooked rice available in supermarkets. Not only are they quick and easy to prepare (I heat the pre-cooked rice in a pan on the hob with a splash of water as I don't have a microwave), but cooked and cooled rice is an excellent source of a type of fibre known as 'resistant starch'. This type of starch doesn't get digested in your small intestine like freshly cooked rice does, but instead ferments in your large intestine where it feeds your gut bacteria and in turn increases your microbiome diversity. *Please note that you should only reheat rice once and ensure that it is piping hot before eating to avoid a risk of food poisoning.

Recipe of the Month - Sticky Plum Chicken Traybake

Serves 4

4 banana shallots, halved or quartered depending on size

6 plums halved and stoned

½ -1 red chilli (or depending on preference), finely sliced

3 garlic cloves, chopped or sliced

8 skinless chicken thighs or drumsticks

1 large cinnamon stick (broken in half) or 2 small sticks

2 star anise

2 tsp Chinese five-spice (optional)

Salt and ground black pepper

1 tbsp olive oil

2 tbsp soy sauce

2-3 tbsp runny honey

300g jasmine rice or 2x 250g packets of microwave jasmine rice

Pak choy or other green vegetables

Lime wedges to dress



- Preheat the oven to 220°C, fan 200°C, gas 7.
- Place shallots, plum quarters, chilli and garlic into a roasting tray. Place the
 chicken on top and poke in the cinnamon sticks and star anise. Sprinkle over
 the Chinese five-spice (if using), a good pinch of salt and pepper, drizzle over
 the olive oil and rub these into the chicken. Add tablespoon or two of water to
 the bottom of the tray to stop the plums from burning. Place in the oven for 30
 minutes.
- Put a medium pan of salted water on to boil. When the chicken has had 30 minutes, remove the tray from the oven and stir in the soy sauce. Drizzle everything with honey and put back into the oven for 20-25 minutes until golden and sticky.
- Meanwhile, cook the rice in the boiling water according to packet instructions or heat for 2 minutes if using microwave rice. Steam or boil the vegetables for 4-5 minutes.
- When the chicken is ready, remove from the oven and shred the meat off the bones into the plum sauce. Taste and tweak the seasoning, adding a little more honey or soy sauce as needed.
- Drain the rice and serve with the sticky chicken and plum sauce, and green veg. Dress with a squeeze of fresh lime if liked.






