### **Parish Council**

The latest meeting of the Parish Council took place on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November. Councillors Edwards, Barter, Smith, Tatner, Williams and Rigg were present, together with the Parish Clerk. Apologies had been received from Cllr Thorne and Wiltshire Councillor Nabil Najjar. Three members of the public were also present. The full minutes of the meeting, together with the papers considered, are available on the village website (<a href="https://www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk">www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk</a>).

The main items on the agenda for this meeting were finance related.

Consideration was given to a request from the Bishopstone Parochial Church Council for an additional grant in the current financial year to help meet unforeseen costs of work to clear overgrown areas of the churchyard, deal with ground subsidence around some of the graves and to make safe the large beech tree on the frontage with Church Lane that had been damaged in a recent storm. After some deliberation it was agreed to make an additional grant of £1,500 and to increase the annual churchyard maintenance grant next year from £550 to £800.

A report was considered which provided an update on finances in 2023/24 and options for the level of the Council Tax Precept for 2024/25. Spending in the current year was well within budget. Major items included the new bench seat commemorating the coronation in the Children's Play Area, the contribution to the resurfacing costs in Pitts Lane and the cost of an additional defibrillator (see below). The level of resources required for next year (2024/25) were more difficult to predict than usual. For example, if the bid to get the speed limit on Broad Chalke Road past the Recreation Field and the White Hart reduced from 40mph to 30mph is successful the Parish Council will be required to contribute towards the legal and signage costs. These could be as much as £3,000. However, if the bid is unsuccessful there will be no cost. Decisions on this issue will not be taken before next Spring. It was agreed that the Council had no option but to budget on the assumption that these costs may arise and that a request to Wiltshire Council for funding from Council Tax next year should be £7,500, up from £5,000 this year. This will add approximately £10.00 to the annual charge on a Band D property in the village. Precise figures cannot be provided pending more data from Wiltshire Council and final decisions will be taken at the next meeting on 11th January.

It had been agreed in principle at the September meeting to install a third public access defibrillator to be located inside the bus shelter at the eastern end of the village, near Church Lane. The electrical supply (for the lights and heating element in the case) would come from an adjacent property. Mike Ash reported that detailed quotations had now been received for the costs of supplying the defibrillator and for the electrical installation work. Altogether the costs would be £2134.80. This expenditure was approved. It is likely that the new defibrillator will be operational by about the end of the year.

Wiltshire Council's proposal to establish a Tree Warden in every parish was discussed – see separate note in this edition of STaB.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on **Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2024** at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

### **Trees and Tree Wardens**

A number of trees in the village were damaged in recent storms, blocking roads, footpaths and the river. The Parish Council is very grateful for volunteers, such as John and Henry Thorne, who turn out to clear debris that is causing disruption. However, responsibility for trees rests with the owner or tenant of the land on which the tree stands. It is their responsibility to ensure that trees on their land, presenting a risk to the general public or property, are safe. They risk being found liable if a vulnerable or dead tree causes an accident or damage.

The Parish Council is therefore asking all landowners/tenants in the village to make a visual check of their trees, particularly those close to roads, footpaths and the river and to clear any showing signs of decay – such as Ash trees suffering from die-back.

Trees, woods and copses are a vital component of the landscape of the Chalke Valley and contribute hugely to the character of our village. Perhaps even more importantly, trees play a key role in combatting the effects of climate change. It is therefore important that they are properly maintained, replaced when necessary and added to when the opportunity arises.

It is against this background that Wiltshire Council is looking to establish volunteer "Tree Wardens" in every parish in the county to act as a contact and support for all things tree related in the local area. The role of the Tree Warden might include such tasks as:

- Identifying trees at risk and reporting, as appropriate, to the Parish Council
  and tree owners any early signs of pests, disease and vandalism and gathering
  information about trees important for wildlife or heritage in the parish.
- Obtaining the permission and goodwill of landowners/tenants in assisting with the wellbeing of trees in the Parish.
- Getting involved in campaigns to raise awareness about the importance of trees
- Exploring opportunities with landowners/tenants and co-ordinating local volunteers to manage community tree and woodland planting.
- Working with the parish council to provide comment on applications for works to trees subject to a Tree Preservation Order or in Conservation Areas.

The great news is that Michael Pratt, who lives in Church Lane, has volunteered to co-ordinate Bishopstone's response. He is happy to act as Tree Warden for the eastern half of the village (up to Faulston Bridge) and is looking to be joined by someone to take the lead in the western part of the village. Wiltshire Council are offering training to assist in the development of the Tree Warden role. It should be emphasised that this role is to provide advice and assistance and no responsibility rests with the Tree Warden(s) or the Parish Council arising from this new role. It is also an aim to establish a larger, informal, support group of landowners, tenants and villagers interested in tree planting and maintaining the well-being of the trees and woodlands we already have.

# Facilities for all the Chalke Valley SPORTS SCENE DECEMBER 2023

The Committee would like to thank the Chalke Valley History Festival for their kind donation of £500. This will be used towards the planned kitchen upgrade so we can improve the catering and sport facilities to the main hall. The sports centre was able to provide ancillary facilities to the festival organisers during their set up and throughout the Event earlier this year.

Broad Chalke Cricket Club, the Petanque Club and the Sports Centre also received donations from the Chalke Valley Fete. With this support, the Petanque Club has purchased indoor mats, and the indoor winter session started last month and takes place on the last Friday each month, 6.30-8.00pm. The Sports Bar is also open.

The Cricket Club has now completed the replacement of the artificial cricket wicket with grants from Broad Chalke Parish Council and SW Wiltshire Area Board. This is all ready for the new season in 2024 and is a great improvement for the Centre.

One of the largest projects since the Sports Centre opened is now being planned. The multi-use games area is approaching the end of its economic life and requires resurfacing. New floodlights were funded last year, and this is the next stage in facility improvements. Site visits with several contractors have taken place and quotations received. Total costs could be £30,000-£50,000 depending on the final specification of works. The Sports Centre Committee have been earmarking funds in a reserve account for the last few years in readiness for this work, but a large sum will still be required from grants and private funding. This is the next key stage of the project. If you would like to know more or are interested in being one of the corporate or private sponsors for the project, please contact one of the committee.

The Executive are delighted to welcome Tim Moss on to the Team. Tim will support the Executive with the Sports Centre website and social media and in the general running and operation of the Centre. We are a small, voluntary committee so every additional pair of hands is most welcomed. If you have a couple of hours you could spare each month, please do contact us, and help keep these wonderful facilities providing sports and recreational opportunities to the Chalke Valley.

Although the weather has changed, there is plenty of sport taking place through the winter period so check out our website for all current activities and how to get involved. A new Tuesday night floodlit recreational tennis session has been added to the calendar. Anyone interested contact Chris.

### **Notes from a Nutritionist by Amber Cotton Nutrition**

For December I've chosen a delicious recipe from Kate Humble's book 'Home Cooked: Recipes from the farm'. Bara Brith, meaning speckled bread, is a traditional Welsh recipe that is a lighter alternative to Christmas cake. The fruit needs to be soaked overnight so plan ahead, and it's best stored for a couple of days before eating to allow the flavours to develop.

Whilst this recipe isn't completely healthy, it still has some healthy nutritional features. Firstly it contains only 50g of sugar which is about a quarter of the sugar found in a traditional Christmas cake. This could be swapped out for the same quantity of coconut sugar though the latter doesn't hold as much moisture so the texture of the cake may be slightly drier and denser when its cooked.

Cranberries are synonymous with Christmas, but their health benefits mean that they deserve to be on the menu far more frequently. Dried cranberries are packed with many of the nutrients found in fresh cranberries and are a rich source of antioxidants and fibre. Dried cranberries also contain plant nutrients called polyphenols which can offer protective benefits to your heart and can support urinary tract health. Do be aware that cranberries are very tart by nature and so are often sweetened to make them more palatable. Look at both the ingredients label and the nutrition facts panel to see if yours are sweetened, by how much, and what they're sweetened with. Often, that's sugar, but they can also be sweetened with apple or pineapple juice.

Sultanas, like dried cranberries are a good source of dietary fibre, and also contain a wide variety of minerals such as calcium, iron, magnesium and zinc. But compared to their fresh counterparts, the drying process reduces their levels of vitamins C and K significantly, and their sugar content rises so you may want to pay attention to portion sizes.

Clementines are at their best at this time of year and are jam-packed with vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. Both clementine juice and zest are rich sources of vitamin C, an essential nutrient that plays a key role in immune health and is a powerful antioxidant.

Finally you'll be glad to know that whisky is said to contain more antioxidants than red wine though don't add more than a glug or the cake won't cook properly.

All that remains is for me to wish you a very happy Christmas and to put in a quick plug for my Nutritional Therapy special offer. ### **Recipe of the Month - Festive Bara Brith**

From: 'Home Cooked: Recipes from the Farm' by Kate Humble

### Makes 1 loaf

### **INGREDIENTS**

120g dried cranberries

120g sultanas

2 tablespoons of local honey

A glug of whisky

160ml strong hot black tea, made using 2 teabags

225g self-raising flour

50g soft brown sugar

50ml milk

1 large egg

Zest and juice of 2 unwaxed (or washed and scrubbed) clementines



### **METHOD**

- Put the cranberries and sultanas in a bowl with the honey and whisky. Pour over the hot tea and leave to soak overnight.
- When you are ready to cook, preheat your oven to 160C and line a 900g (2lb) loaf tin. Add the flour and sugar to the dried fruit and mix well.
- Mix together the milk and egg and add the clementine juice and zest. Add to the fruit mix and stir until everything is combined.
- Pour into the tin and bake for about an hour, until a skewer comes out clean.
- Cool in the tin and then on a wire rack. Serve with butter or a slice of hard cheese.


