Parish Council

The latest meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council was held on Thursday 10th November. Present were Cllrs Thorne, Edwards, Barter, Smith, Williams and Rigg, together with the Parish Clerk, Wiltshire Councillor Nabil Najjar and one member of the public.

The only substantive item on the agenda was to review the outcome of expenditure against the budget for the current year, the draft budget for 2023/24 and the Precept request for that year to be submitted to Wiltshire Council. It was likely that expenditure in 2022/23 would be less than the agreed budget, mainly due to underspends on contingent items such as repairs and maintenance. A budget for 2023/24 was agreed which includes grants of £550 for churchyard maintenance and £350 to the Chalke Valley Sports Centre. The parish precept for the current year was £10,000. However, in the light of underspends and the balance of the reserves, it was agreed to reduce the precept to £5,000 for 2023/24. As a result, the parish council's share of the council tax paid by householders in the village will reduce from £35.79 in 2022/23 to £17.78 in 2023/24.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on **Thursday 12th January 2023** at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

Please Look After Your Trees

Trees play a key role in creating the beautiful landscape of the Chalke Valley and the character of Bishopstone village. The open nature of the higher downland contrasts with the more heavily wooded valley of the River Ebble. But sadly all is not well. Many trees in the village are either dead or dying – as a result of Ash die back disease, due to old age or a lack of proper care and maintenance. This will have a significant effect on the appearance of some parts of the village.

The fungus that causes Ash die back is spread by spores from infected trees. It is now likely that many, if not all, Ash trees in the village will eventually be infected (it is estimated that, nationally, 80% of Ash trees will be lost).

The disease has the ability to turn a perfectly healthy tree into a hazard within a very short space of time. Not only does it cause severe die back in the canopy of the tree, it can also cause the timber to become brittle making it more susceptible to failure.

The combination of large dead or dying trees and the very strong winds that we now experience as part of our changing weather pattern creates an obvious danger to passing people and vehicles. In the last month volunteers from within the village have cleared two trees that were blocking roads. We should be very grateful to them for turning out, often in awful weather. However, it is unfair for the rest of us to rely on this service to be able to go about our daily business. Falling trees can also damage power and telephone lines - recently the Flamstone Street area of the village was left in darkness for nearly nine hours. Hedgerow trees and woodlands that border the roadside are the responsibility of the adjoining landowner, <u>not</u> the highway authority.

The Parish Council will shortly be taking action to remove several trees in the Recreation Field and we would ask all other landowners to have a look at any trees on your land (both Ash trees and others) – particularly ones close to public rights of way, such as roads and footpaths. If they show signs of being dead or dying, arrange for them to be inspected and, if necessary, removed or made safe. Some residents have already taken action – thank you. Please remember that you require formal permission from Wiltshire Council if the tree is located within the Conservation Area (map on the village website). Recent applications have been submitted concerning trees in Bridge Road and Chapel Lane. There should be no problem in obtaining permission if the tree is dead or dying.

As trees are lost it will become more than ever important to plant alternative native species replacements wherever possible. We may not be the beneficiaries of this but future generations will thank us.

Get a Grip!

In the very heavy rain that we now experience the roads in the village often flood. Drainage of most of the back roads in the village is by way of small channels (called "grips") cut into the bank at the side of the road and which take water into the river or the nearest drainage ditch or gully. However, the grips get clogged with mud, fallen leaves etc. They are regularly cleared by the Parish Steward, but he only comes round once a month. It only takes the work of a few minutes with a spade to clear debris from the mouth of the grip to get water flowing into them again. So, if you feel inclined, please clear any grips near you.

Staying in Touch

STaB magazine is a vital source of communication in the village, keeping everyone informed as to what is happening locally. However, the Covid-19 pandemic has highlighted the fact that situations can change very rapidly. To keep up to date with what is going on there are two other important sources of information in Bishopstone - the village website and our own WhatsApp network.

The village website – <u>www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk</u> is updated in real time and carries all the latest news on issues that affect the village.



The Bishopstone Network is a WhatsApp messaging service that has more than proved its worth during the pandemic, and more recently during the storms when residents were able to report fallen trees and blocked roads to the Emergency Planning Officer. Information can be instantly shared to your mobile phone about support services being

provided in the village and on a variety of other matters – everything from the length of electricity black outs to what is available from the White Hart take-away service! You will need to download the App to your phone and then contact Piers Edwards (piersgedwards@gmail.com or 07920 475009) or Kate Pendlenton (kmpendlenton@hotmail.com or 07769202200) and ask to be added to the group.

Emergency Planning- Vulnerable Residents and Cold Weather

As we go into the cold months you may not be aware that vulnerable residents can apply to be added to a secure list of vulnerable people which is shared with emergency services and some utilities providers such as water and electricity.

Warm & Safe Wiltshire have a Priority Service Register for the **over 60**'s and **families with young children** or **people with disability** in the event of a loss of electricity or power. They provide free telephone advice on 0800 038 5722 and can arrange free home visits.

This service is provided by Wiltshire Council, Swindon Borough Council, Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue and the Centre for sustainable energy.

On Our Night Sky - Uranus

From time immemorial there had been only 6 known planets. Then a German musician and composer William Herschel came along. He was initially brought over as a member of a band by George II. However, after the defeat of Hanover, where George II actually fought in the field against the French, William went AWOL and moved permanently to England as a musician, much later joined by his younger sister who assisted in his astronomical work, herself later making discoveries and contributions of her own, significant even today. An amateur astronomer, he built his own telescopes improving on Newton's reflecting design, spending months polishing the curved metal bowls, his biggest was 120cm across.

His discovery of Uranus in 1781 doubled the size of the known Solar System. Until recent years it was seen as an almost featureless blue disc, but enigmatic as it is the only planet with its equator perpendicular to its orbit and where does its magnetic field come from?

Uranus is the inner of the now called (water) Ice Giants with an apt blue colour. Modern observations have shown a small rocky core, surrounded by water and ammonia ices with some methane, making up 80% of the planet's mass. The upper third is liquid, but more interestingly the inner material is thought to be superionic, with a temperature at the core of 5,000 deg.C. Water at extreme temperatures and pressures allows H+ ions in effect to move rapidly and generate high conductivity, which with movement generates a magnetic field, which again is unusual being 60 deg. away from its axis of rotation.

The atmosphere, which gradually merges with the outer core, is primarily hydrogen with helium and 2% methane, which gives the blue colour.

Herschel did note that there may be a red ring around the planet, but no-one else could find rings until 1977 (200 years later) and the red ring was confirmed. In 1800 during studies of sunspots using filters to reduce the intensity of the sun's rays he felt more heat with some; then using a prism he separated the components of light and discovered infra-red, beyond the red. The explanation of electromagnetic radiation would later be set forth by James Clerk Maxwell in 1861, whose

calculation of the speed of light would prompt Einstein to his great theory.

Recipe of the Month - Cranberry and Brie Puffs

Three ingredients and 30 minutes make these Cranberry-Brie bites the easiest and fastest appetiser of all time. Ingredients

1 pack of ready rolled puff pastry

Cranberry sauce - jar or homemade


Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F. With a sharp knife cut the sheets into approximately 3 inch x 3 inch squares. Press each square into a muffin cavity.
- 2. Cube the cheese about a 3/4 inch cube for each (you may have a little cheese left over). Place a cube of brie in the centre of each puff pastry square. Top the brie with a small dollop (about 2 teaspoons) of cranberry sauce.
- 3. Bake for about 10 mins until puff pastry corners are toasted lightly brown.
- 4. Allow to cool for 5 minutes.



Police Bulletin

A new monthly newsletter from Philip Wilkinson, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire.



Policing has been under the microscope in the last year and I don't see this scrutiny letting up any time soon – and neither should it.

The public want their police force to keep them safe, protect vulnerable people, put victims first, catch the criminals responsible, produce quality investigations and lock the bad ones up.

Wiltshire Police has had its fair share of criticism. It has received a poor PEEL inspection report and is currently in 'special measures'. I can reassure you progress is being made and my scrutiny of that performance is ongoing.

We have had some solid successes too. You told me road safety and speeding was a key concern. I have committed investment into the roads policing unit, increasing the number of officers and cars by 20%.

We also tripled the capacity of the speed enforcement team, with extra police staff and state-of-the-art cameras. With this joined up approach, there are more traffic officers on our streets and there has been an increase of 42% of the number of people caught speeding and given tickets.

There is still more to do but our roads will become safer as the deterrent of speeding tickets and prosecution starts to bite.

The rural crime team has also doubled since I committed investment in the team and in extra equipment. I was also pleased with the force's commitment to visit all victims of home burglary – let me know if this doesn't happen and I will act on your behalf to scrutinise that commitment.

We are also in the process of recruiting the next Chief Constable of Wiltshire Police and I hope to have them confirmed in post by mid January. We look forward to welcoming them to the county.

In the meantime, our current Chief will carry on implementing the improvements needed to satisfy HM Inspectors and provide stability so the force can continue making Wiltshire safer for all.

Please also make sure you take part in my survey, taking place in December and January, which will ask you about your confidence levels in Wiltshire Police and about the policing precept for 2023/24.

It is important we capture as many people's thoughts as possible and you will find this on my website from mid December.

As ever, I wish you a safe and happy Christmas and New Year.

Sarah's Gardening Tips for December/January

- Plant deciduous, climbing honeysuckle now but avoid any frozen or waterlogged ground.
- 2. Leave faded heads of hydrangeas on until spring, to protect new buds from the frost.
- 3. Harvest holly with berries for making Christmas wreaths and garlands.
- 4. Prune grape vines.
- 5. Lift your last leeks and parsnips before the soil gets too frozen
- 6. Dig over empty borders and pile manure on top. Let the worms and frosts break up the clods of soil.
- 7. Prune fruit trees to maintain an open balanced structure. Leave plums and cherries until the summer.
- 8. Cover winter brassicas with netting to protect from pigeons.






