

#### Bishopstone Village Hall rates for private hire

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

The hire charges include use of heating and electricity.

An additional charge is made for use of the broadband connection of £6 per hour with a maximum of £25 per day.

#### Large projection screen

#### **Hemlock Water Dropwort**

We are in the middle of the Hemlock Water Dropwort season. It is the most poisonous plant in the UK and can be found, mainly, along river banks, including the banks of the River Ebble. It looks a bit like Cow Parsley but should never be touched because all parts of the plant are poisonous. Thanks to the efforts of Norman Barter, and others, in undertaking work to remove these plants there is less HWD around this year. However, some examples remain – including a large outcrop near Croucheston Mill. Please avoid contact with these plants if at all possible.

# Facilities for all the Chalke Valley SPORTS SCENE JULY 2023

The Sports Centre's AGM took place in June and the current Committee agreed to continue in their roles. These roles are critical to the running of the Centre with all the usual matters around buildings and grounds maintenance, cleaning, grant applications, managing bookings and the seemingly, at times, myriad of other tasks that crop up with a facility of this size and complexity. Without our Affiliated Clubs, there would be no sport at the Centre, but without the Committee there would be no Sports Centre. We are always looking for volunteers to help so if you are interested in investing some time back into our wonderful community, please contact one of the Committee.

At the AGM our Treasurer, Michaela, presented the accounts for last year and, looking forward, a budget for the coming 12 months. This projects a loss of some £1500 and so there is work to be done to raise funds and seek to reduce costs. It will also mean that hire and membership fees will need to be increased and, for the first time, a junior membership is being introduced. With inflation running near 10% and energy costs through the roof, there are few options for the Committee right now. That being said, the Sports Centre is in a relatively healthy financial position on its Balance Sheet. This is due to prudent management and much work in the last two years to secure grants. We have also for a number of years been setting aside funds in preparation for some significant capital works that will need attention in the next couple of years. Our aim is to continue this approach to enable matching funds.


We would like to thank Broad Chalke, Bishopstone and Bowerchalke parish councils for their continued financial support of the centre. This is very much appreciated.

Looking back over the year, a major improvement was undertaken with the replacement of the multiuse games area floodlights that had reached the end of their economic life, with spares no longer available. We now have much more efficient units and ones that are more environmentally sensitive.

Our Sports Clubs are now in full swing again and full details of activities can be found on our website. We are also looking forward and making plans with the Fete and Show Committee for the 2023 event on 19 August 1.00pm-4.00pm. Lots of new attractions as well as the much-enjoyed ones from last year. Check the Chalke Valley Fete website and start thinking about your Show entries. There is something for everyone.

#### SOME MORE MEMORIES FROM PAT DRAPER

#### **BISHOPSTONE VILLAGE 1951**

Having written about the 'Bones' I had forgotten about the 'Heart' and caring spirit of the people who lived here.

Two local roadmen, Tom Everett and Maurice Cook, kept all the village roads and verges in such good condition all year round. Postmen delivered the mail on their bicycles.

Mr Len Gould, the landlord of the White Hart, provided a taxi service when needed. The pub had darts teams playing matches with pubs in the Valley or in Salisbury. There were great celebrations when they won the matches. A football team and a cricket team both had many supporters when they played.





When Netton Close was built, the Rev and Mrs Hall visited the new residents and told them about a club being formed. They also asked Dr Martin and Diana Brett who were interested, and subsequently offered their home Yondover in Stratford Tony as a meeting place. It was later decided to meet at 7.30pm on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month in members' homes. It would be known as The Young Wives Club. I had returned to the village in 1953 and was delighted to become a member. We had a very varied programme of speakers, discussions and outings. In the fullness of time we became The Ladies Group, still enjoying our evenings together.

The Hall has been an essential part of the village life. In 1940 it was used as a school room to help with the extra pupils when the evacuees arrived. They shared schooling with the village children and were pleased to play together when free. My husband, John, was one of the pupils at that time. We were pleased to meet one of his school friends, who had returned with his family to show them where he had lived as a boy. Mr Gould at The White Hart said he had met several of the pupils who had returned, saying that Bishopstone had been a friendly place to live.

Does anyone recognise any of the other ladies?

So many people used the Hall over the years. The Women's Institute were very much a part of life and arranged many outings. A memorable one in my life was 1956 when we went to the Isle of Wight. My mother joined us and never forgot how wonderful it was – sunshine and flowers all day. There were country dancing classes, whist drives, plays and concerts. The Youth Club used the Hall, and it also had its own local band of musicians playing for dances and were welcomed in other valley villages. My source told me their name was Ted Emm and The Emmets. He assures me that they always had a very good reception wherever they went.

The Meals on Wheels service provided for those who needed help. It extended from Berwick St John to Bodenham. As volunteers we delivered hot meals at lunchtime on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The meals were collected from Broad Chalke Village School. In the holidays they were collected from the Wilton Army Garrison and they were very popular. It meant that the elderly had a visit three times a week. One lady advised me to change my butcher but in the main they were pleased to see us!

What a treat we have in store for you this year!







#### **Notes from a Nutritionist**

#### Welcome to July's 'Notes from a Nutritionist'

My recipe choice this month was vetoed by my 19-year-old daughter who said that I needed to offer a recipe that was sweet, filled with seasonal raspberries, and preferably covered with chocolate – so this month here is her TikTok-inspired recipe for 'Chocolate-Covered Raspberry Bites'.

These bites are an easy-to-make recipe that uses just 5 ingredients: fresh raspberries, chia seeds, dark chocolate, a tiny bit of coconut oil, and flaky sea salt.

Fresh raspberries are both sweet and tart at this time of year and are absolutely delicious. They are loaded with antioxidants, vitamins and minerals, and are rich in fibre. They also taste wonderful paired with chocolate.

Chia seeds are packed with fibre and healthy omega-3 fatty acids and may help to lower LDL cholesterol. They also slow down digestion which can prevent blood sugar spikes after eating a meal. Mashing the raspberries with chia seeds helps to bind the fruit together and you can add a teaspoon of maple syrup or honey for extra sweetness if desired.

Dark chocolate is decadent and delicious as well as having a variety of health benefits. If you buy quality dark chocolate with a high cocoa content, then it's quite nutritious in small quantities. It contains a decent amount of fibre and is loaded with minerals including iron, magnesium, copper and potassium. If you add a teaspoon of coconut oil or butter to the melted chocolate, then it will help you to achieve a super-shiny chocolate coating. Without it, the melted chocolate will appear matte once dry but still taste delicious.

Finally, you could add a small sprinkle of sea salt for extra flavour. Make sure you use high-quality sea salt crystals as they contain may of the major electrolytes, like sodium, magnesium, calcium and potassium that are essential for good health.

I hope you enjoy this month's recipe and I'll be very happy to pass on any feedback to my daughter. Some of you have already sent me lovely emails about my recipes and I just wanted to say thank you – it's nice to know that people have enjoyed cooking something new. And also do get in touch if you think I may be able to help you with any niggling health issues. I'm very happy to have a confidential conversation about anything that's bothering you and will be honest about whether I think I can help or not.

#### Recipe of the Month - Chocolate Covered Raspberry Bites

#### Makes 8 - 10

170g of fresh raspberries

1 tbsp chia seeds

1 tsp honey or maple syrup (optional)

150g good quality dark chocolate

1 tsp coconut oil or unsalted butter

Pinch of sea salt flakes


#### **METHOD**




- Line a baking tray with greaseproof paper
- In a bowl, mash the raspberries with the back of a fork until they are broken down.
- Add in the chia seeds (and maple syrup or honey if using) and stir well until combined. Leave for 5-10 minutes to thicken.
- Scoop small amounts of the raspberry-chia mixture onto the prepared baking sheet (about 1 tablespoon per bite). Place in the freezer for one hour or until frozen.
- Place the chocolate into a small bowl and either melt over a pan of barely simmering water (don't let the water touch the bottom of the bowl) or melt in a microwave for 60 seconds, stirring halfway through. Mix in the coconut oil or butter until well combined.
- Dip the frozen raspberry-chia bites into the chocolate until completely coated, and place back on to the prepared baking tray.
- Sprinkle a few salt flakes over the wet chocolate of each bite.
- Place the chocolate-dipped raspberry bites back into the freezer for an hour or so until set.
- Once frozen, transfer into an airtight container and store in the freezer for up to 3 months. When ready to eat, allow the frozen raspberry bites to soften for 1-2 minutes before serving.




