SAFEGUARDING LIVES IN BISHOPSTONE



At the beginning of February a third public access Automated External Defibrillator (AED) was installed in the village. This one, in the bus shelter near the Church Lane junction, joins that in the kiosk opposite Pitts Lane and that on the front wall of the Village Hall. These now provide a pretty good coverage of the village. What are these for, who can use them, when and how?

AEDs are used to revive someone suffering a sudden cardiac arrest. In a cardiac arrest unconsciousness can result from the heart rhythm being too fast or uncoordinated to provide an effective blood flow to the body and brain. When this happens, the brain and other vital organs don't get the blood and oxygen they need. This requires treatment within minutes to prevent death. Defibrillation can

restart the heart into an effective rhythm and the sooner the heart rhythm is restored, the greater the chance there won't be permanent damage to the brain and other organs.

Our AEDs are available for anyone to use to jolt a heart back to a regular rhythm, possibly saving a life. The key steps in performing a rescue are set out in the diagram opposite.

Having ascertained that the patient is unresponsive the first step is to call the emergency services. Then, without waiting for their arrival, use the AED.




Our AEDs are contained in unlocked round containers that twist to the left to open. Inside is a bag containing the AED itself and a rescue kit which includes a torch, scissors for removing clothing, a high viz jacket and other useful items. The AED is very easy to use. It is **fully automated**, which means that it gives step by step voice instructions telling you what to do and when to do it. The unit itself evaluates the heart rhythm, decides whether a shock is required and delivers it. **The rescuer does not need to decide whether a shock is required or to actually deliver it.** If necessary the unit will instruct the rescuer to administer CPR.



Many in the village attended previous short training courses on the use of AEDs arranged by the Parish Council. If there is sufficient further interest we will hold another one. If you are interested please let Mike Ash know on 01722 781044 or bishopstoneclerk@btinternet.com.

A training video will also be shown at the Annual Parish Meeting in the Village Hall on 14th March and can also be found on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk).

In addition, this year it is intended to include a discussion about the possible activities of the new parish Tree Wardens, established under an initiative by Wiltshire Council to promote proper tree maintenance and encourage woodland planting, and to show a video on how the Automated External Defibrillators in the village can be used to treat sudden cardiac arrest.

Everyone is welcome to attend.

The APM will be followed by the March meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council.

Bishopstone Village Hall rates for private hire

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

February was a quiet month, but it meant some long overdue work could be undertaken on the Centre's boiler room where all the hot and cold-water pipe work has been replaced. 

Some of you may have heard that there have been some staff changes within the Post Office with the departure of one member of staff. Ed Rigg, our Postmaster assures us that this will not lead to a change or reduction in the hours that the Hub Post Office is open. As always, the Post Office will be open on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday mornings between 9.30am and 1pm continuing to provide the same essential services.

However, as with any small independent business, it has to be used to survive. The recent media focus on Post Office Ltd will have highlighted to many of you how hard it is to run a post office and sadly it has also meant that some people have chosen not to support their local post offices anymore, to the detriment of the already struggling self-employed Post Masters. So please, if you want our local post office to keep trading, come in and support it. It does so much more than sell stamps! Did you know that at the post office you can also carry out everyday banking for most high street banks (personal and business), bill payments & electric key top ups, vehicle tax, redirection of mail, and of course posting letters & parcels? Foreign currency can be arranged.

Moving on to the shop – Clark's wide range of meat and poultry is proving to be very popular and we will be taking stock in from Clark's twice a week.

Our newest product is milk from Nunton Farm Dairy, a family run farm near Salisbury producing award-winning milk from their free-range herd of Friesian cows. The milk is pasteurized to ensure optimal quality whilst retaining its wholesome goodness. Their whole unhomogenised milk with the natural cream rising to the top adds a rich and velvety texture. Nunton Dairy pride themselves on their sustainability credentials; they feed any leftover unsold milk to their calves.

We do not have an outside vending machine for the milk. Deliveries to the shop are made twice a week. Bottles are on sale in the shop; the first bottle has to be paid for and after that customers only pay for the milk, if the empty bottle is returned.

The café continues to offer a great range of drinks, cakes and hot meals; Jayne's recently introduced new menu is going down well with our regulars. Come in and try it out if you haven't visited us before.

Notes from a Nutritionist by Amber Cotton Nutrition

This month's recipe is a delicious squidgy cake using almonds, frozen raspberries and delicious seasonal pink rhubarb – because even Nutritional Therapists like a slice of cake every now and then.

Although almonds are commonly referred to as a nut, they are in fact edible seeds that are the fruit of the almond tree. You can buy them shelled or blanched, which is when shelled almonds have been treated with hot water to remove the brown outer coating, leaving behind the familiar smooth white interior. Although almonds are high in fat, much of this is in the form of monosaturated fat, which can help to protect the heart by maintaining levels of high-density lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol.

Almonds are also rich in many important nutrients including magnesium, the antioxidant vitamin E and fibre (though blanched almonds won't contain as much fibre as shelled almonds as much of their fibre is in the brown outer coating). They also contain both calcium and phosphorus which are good for bone health.

This cake contains ground almonds, also known as almond flour, which will help to keep this squidgy cake fresh for longer (though you should keep it in a cool, dry place).

Stems of vibrant pink rhubarb are currently in the shops, and are used in both sweet and savoury dishes. Health benefits of rhubarb include helping to keep bones strong, aiding digestion and reducing inflammation. It is also a good source of vitamin K which is essential for blood clotting, allowing wounds to heal.

When I made this cake, I added the chopped stems of rhubarb directly into the cake tin as I like the sharper flavour, but if you wanted a slightly sweeter flavour then you could briefly roast the rhubarb before you add it to the cake. (Place in a single layer on a greased baking sheet and roast for 15 minutes at 180°C or 160°C fan. Allow to cool before using).

I've gently flavoured the cake with the zest of an orange as it complements the sharper flavour of the rhubarb, but you could easily add half a teaspoon of ground ginger (or more) if you preferred. Don't add the juice of the orange though as this will make the cake too wet.

Finally, I've added a couple of handfuls of frozen raspberries to this cake for added vitamin C, fibre and antioxidants though you could easily swap them for blueberries instead. Whilst raspberries and blueberries aren't currently in season in the UK, frozen berries are a great freezer staple and can be added to many sweet dishes and smoothies. The berries are frozen shortly after picking which means that all their nutritious goodness is preserved.

Whilst this cake does contain sugar, it isn't too sweet so, as well as being an afternoon treat with a cup of tea, it would also make a delicious pudding served gently warmed with cream or Greek yogurt. I hope you enjoy it.

Recipe of the Month - Rhubarb, Raspberry and Almond Cake

150g salted butter, at room temperature 150g golden caster sugar + 2 tbsp extra

2 medium eggs

200g ground almonds

Finely grated zest of 1 orange

100g self-raising flour

1 tsp baking powder

350g new season rhubarb stems (trimmed and cut into 4cm lengths)



70g frozen raspberries or blueberries (softened but no need to completely defrost)
2 tbsp flaked almonds

Icing sugar to dust

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 180°C or 160°C fan. Grease a 22cm springform tine and line the base and sides with baking paper.

Put the butter and sugar into a bowl and cream together with an electric whisk until pale and fluffy. Whisk in the eggs one at a time until creamy. Add the ground almonds and orange zest, sift over the flour and baking powder and mix well.

Spoon half the mixture into the tin, spreading it as much as you can right to the edges. Arrange just under half the rhubarb and some of the berries on top and then sprinkle over 1 tablespoon of the extra sugar.

Spoon over the rest of the cake mixture, then spread it out to cover the rhubarb. The mixture will be very sticky so even it out as best you can but don't worry if there are some gaps. Arrange the rest of the rhubarb and berries on top. Sprinkle with the remaining extra sugar and scatter over the flaked almonds.

Bake for 1 hour until golden, cover with a tent of foil and bake for another 10-15 minutes until firm to touch in the middle. Leave in the tin to cool before transferring to a wire rack. If not serving warm, allow to cool completely.

The cake can be stored in an airtight container for up to 3 days in a cool place.





Police Bulletin

A monthly newsletter from Philip Wilkinson, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire.



After a period of public consultation, I presented my final proposal for the policing precept of your council tax to the Police and Crime Panel this month.

Wiltshire Police is facing increased financial pressures as we strive to deliver the necessary service improvements required, which led to the panel supporting my decision to increase the precept by 5.2%, an extra £1.09 a month or £13 a year for the average Band D property.

This, alongside a grant from the government, accounts for the core budget for policing in the county.

The decision to increase the precept has been a difficult but necessary one. I am listening to residents when they tell me that they want a better and improved service from both the police and wider criminal justice system with improved outcomes and more visibility.

The public voted in favour of the rise, with 85% of respondents to my recent Policing, Priorities and ££s survey saying they wanted to see more investment in policing.

Whilst key improvements have been delivered over past 12 months, including a fourfold improvement in positive outcomes for Rape and Serious Sexual Offences and Wiltshire Police becoming one of the top performing forces nationally in disrupting county lines per head in capita, there is still much to do to make Wiltshire safer as crime and policing demand becomes ever more complex.

Even by putting the precept up by £13 a year, we still need to make savings of £2.4m to cover the funding gap. We remain one of the worst funded force areas in the country, but I will continue to lobby the government for fairer funding.

Both the Chief Constable and I are committed to delivering a policing service which meets an ever-changing crime picture and is fit for the future.

I am confident that with this increase we can continue to invest in key areas to maintain the improvements that we are now seeing across the board.





The Great Amphibian Migration

We are just coming to the end of the time of year when toads and frogs travel back to their ancestral breeding ponds to lay their eggs. You will doubtless have noticed this, if only because of the sad sight of some squashed specimens on our village roads.

'Toad Patrols' are relatively common across the country - volunteers who go out at night to transport the toads across roads to the ponds but the problem we have found in Bishopstone is that there are so many bodies of water in the village (the river and its tributaries, the lakes, and various garden ponds) that it's impossible to know where the poor creatures are going and therefore help them along! We have been out as a family on a couple of evenings and made it our mission simply to move them off the roads (attempting to ascertain in which direction they are heading!), but we would like to urge villagers to drive with caution while they are on the move.


