Achievements and Perforchurchmance

In addition to the ministry of the two stipendiary clergy in the Chalke Valley Team, all the activities covered in this report rely upon the support of volunteers: our non- stipendiary Team Vicar (The Revd Canon Jenny Taylor) who is responsible for the pastoral care of the Parish, retired Clergy, Churchwardens, Lay Worship Leader, Lay Pastoral Assistants, PCC members and all who give of their time, energy and financial support to ensure that services take place in a well preserved building, the Churchyard is maintained and the Church is able to serve the wider community.

Policies The PCC reviews its policies on **Health & Safety, Safeguarding and Financial Management** issues annually, in line with Church of England policy.

Worship The regular pattern of two Sunday services of Parish Communion a month continued without any restrictions and the occasional 1st Sunday Morning Service was resumed. On 29 May 2022 an appropriately themed service celebrated the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. A Book of Condolence was placed in the Church to mark the occasion of her death.

This report would not normally be complete without an acknowledgement of the contribution of Dr Richard Seal to the musical life of the Church. However, in July, the PCC and a much wider community were greatly saddened to learn of his death. The numbers attending his funeral in our church and at the subsequent Memorial Service in Salisbury Cathedral were testament to his national reputation within Church Music. A fund was established in his memory for the much needed restoration of our church organ planned to take place in 2023. We were immensely grateful that Mr John Powell, Mr Arthur Willoughby, Mrs Shelagh Lamb and Mrs Margaret Barter were able to step in to continue to support our services.

From the Registers 2 Weddings and 4 Funerals were conducted in the Church.

Mission and Outreach Pastoral support to individuals in our community continued to be provided by the Team Vicar and Lay Pastoral Assistants. 2022 Mission Giving was: £500 to the Deanery Chalke-Cueibet Link, £200 to Morning Star, £250 to Salisbury Foodbank and £50 to Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust. The Augustus Montgomery Coal Trust funds administered by the PCC have provided financial assistance to individuals in need in the Parish. Our Lent Appeal Coffee Mornings for the Salisbury Women's Refuge raised £1,331.50.

Our magazine, STaB, a leader among the Chalke Valley magazines, continues to play a valuable role in the life of our community. The PCC is grateful for the work of the Editorial Team in maintaining such a high quality magazine, for the contributors and for the team of volunteers who deliver it.

Fabric The PCC is very grateful to the Friends of Bishopstone Church for their support in ensuring that the building is well maintained and secure. Fortunately, there have been no major calls on their resources.

The day to day care and welcoming appearance of the building and churchyard, cleaning, flower arranging and refreshments after services are undertaken at no cost to the PCC. These and other items of maintenance could not happen without the generosity of finance and time of a small number of volunteers.

Financial Review

In 2022, activities in the PCC's General (unrestricted) Fund were, Total receipts: £31,363.96 (2021- £30,881.89) against Expenditure of £31,059.04 (2021- £27,119.67), giving a slight surplus of £304.92 (2021- surplus £3,762). Unsurprisingly, expenditure increased and the PCC will need to consider how to encourage financial support to meet this. The PCC is grateful to the Parish Council for its financial contribution to STaB and the cost of churchyard maintenance.

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the PCC to maintain, where possible, a balance on our unrestricted funds which equates to one year's running costs to cover any emergencies that may arise, particularly bearing in mind the significant costs that can be incurred when work is required to the church building.

Volunteers needed!

Do you have a relative or friend buried in our churchyard? Many of us do, and we can keep the grave neat and tidy. But there are many graves whose relatives have moved away from the area, or who have no-one to care for them. Our churchyard will soon be scanned, so that an accurate plan can be made, and inscriptions can be recorded. But our churchyard is looking neglected, and we need volunteers to help us tidy it.

Brambles need to be cleared from the eastern boundary as some graves have been engulfed by them. Help with trimming the hedges, weeding the gravel areas around the church, removing ivy from headstones, and general tidying of the area, are just some of the tasks which need to be done.

We have volunteers who keep the church itself clean and tidy, volunteers who arrange flowers, but we also need volunteers to help us tidy up the churchyard and keep it looking lovely too. Could you help by giving just for an hour or two, every now and then? If so please e-mail me at, theseal1@outlook.com giving me contact details, and the sort of task that you would feel able to do.

Hopefully we can then organise some teams to tackle these problems.

Parish Council

The next meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council will take place on **Thursday 4th May 2023 starting at 7.00pm in the Village Hall**. All are welcome to attend.

The agenda for the meeting will be posted on the village notice boards and on the village website.

Nobody from within the parish has yet come forward to take on the role of Parish Clerk (see below, and the village website). The Council will decide what to do at the May meeting, but this will probably mean advertising the vacancy more widely. It would be so much better if the job was taken on by someone who actually lives here so, if you think you might possibly be interested, please discuss with one of your Councillors or with the current Clerk, Mike Ash.

PARISH CLERK

As announced in the last edition of STaB, we are looking for someone to take over the job of Clerk to the Parish Council from Mike Ash. This is a part-time job with flexible hours which would suit someone who has recently retired, but wants to stay active and contribute to the life of the village, or it can easily be fitted in with other work.

The job involves:

- organising six meetings of the Council a year: agreeing an agenda with the Chairman, drafting any background papers and producing the minutes;
- making sure the Council meets legal requirements as to its governance and financial management (securing funding, dealing with accounts and audit);
- managing projects undertaken by the Council (it spends about £5,000 a year on improvements in the village);
- representing the Council and acting as the main point of contact with Wiltshire Council (responding to consultations, raising issues requiring action, attending some meetings etc);
- helping to resolve problems arising in the village.

Details are in the March edition of STaB and on the village website. Mike is willing to stay on whilst a new Clerk learns the ropes. Please contact him for more information.

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

The hire charges include use of heating and electricity.

The Bishopstone Network is a WhatsApp messaging service that has more than proved its worth during the pandemic, and more recently during the storms when residents were able to report fallen trees and blocked roads to the Emergency Planning Officer. Information can be instantly shared to your mobile phone about support services being provided in the village and on a variety of other matters – everything from the length of electricity black outs to what is available from the White Hart take-away service! Salisbury Foodbank





Notes from a Nutritionist

Welcome to May's 'Notes from a Nutritionist'

This month I've chosen a delicious spring recipe that showcases the abundance of wild garlic that we have around the Chalke Valley at this time of year.

Chicken piccata recipes traditionally use chicken breasts, but I've chosen to use chicken thighs instead. Not only is thigh meat much more succulent than the breast meat, but it's hard to overcook them and they are less expensive to buy.

Nutritionally, chicken thighs are an excellent source of many essential nutrients. Iron and zinc, which are important for a healthy immune system, are present in much higher quantities in dark meat than in white meat, and chicken thighs are a great source of all eight B vitamins which are important for supporting your energy levels and brain function.

Green beans are a good source of fibre which can help to lower cholesterol. They also contain a B vitamin called folate and potassium, both of which help to regulate blood pressure.

To add a flavour punch, I've added shredded wild garlic. The headline health benefit of wild garlic is its effectiveness in helping to lower blood pressure, but it also has antibacterial, antibiotic and antiseptic properties, and best of all it grows in weed-like abundance around South Wiltshire.

Finally, new potatoes are a great source of vitamin C and as you don't peel them, they are a good source of fibre.

Finish off the dish with a scattering of antioxidant-rich capers and lemon zest, some heart-friendly olive oil, and mineral-rich parmesan cheese, and you have a tasty midweek meal that is ready in under 30 minutes.

Recipe of the Month - Chicken Piccata with Garlicky Greens

By Amber Cotton

Serves 2

- 200g new potatoes, halved or quartered
- 300g green beans, trimmed
- 100g wild garlic, trimmed, washed and shredded
- 2-4 skinless boneless chicken thighs (depending on their size)
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 100ml chicken stock
- 1 tbsp drained capers
- 1 unwaxed lemon, zested and juiced
- 1 tbsp grated Parmesan



METHOD

- Cook the new potatoes in a large pan of boiling salted water for 8-10 mins until tender. Add the green beans for the last 3 mins. Drain, then separate the beans from the potatoes.
- While the potatoes are cooking, flatten out each chicken thigh and brush with 1-2 tablespoons of the olive oil, then season.
- Heat a large frying pan over a medium-high heat and cook the chicken for 5-7 mins on each side until golden and cooked through.
- Pour over the stock, capers, lemon juice and zest, then simmer gently for a few minutes to reduce. Season to taste.
- Heat the remaining oil in another pan. Add the drained beans and shredded wild garlic, and season to taste. Toss to combine then scatter over the Parmesan and serve with the chicken and potatoes.

My office is once again looking to help fund voluntary groups, organisations and charities that tackle major issues like anti-social behaviour, drug and alcohol related crimes and supporting young people.

Each year we work in partnership with Wiltshire Community Foundation (WCF) to award grants to community and voluntary groups who support the delivery of my Police and Crime Plan. It's a really great way for us to give back to the community with the money raised from unclaimed property.


I wanted to make the grants even more accessible for those smaller community groups this year, so the eligibility criteria and application process itself has been redesigned as well as there now being multiple opportunities to apply throughout the year.

In previous years we have awarded thousands of pounds to some incredible causes which have made a huge difference to the lives of people living in Wiltshire and Swindon, including Youth Adventure Trust which works with vulnerable and disadvantaged children aged 11-16 from deprived areas to run activity days for young people.

Another example is Warminster and Westbury youth clubs which were forced to close during the lockdowns. The grant enabled the clubs to cover the costs of reopening in line with guidelines and to ensure they were Covid-safe.






