# Parish Council

The meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council which was to have taken place on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September was cancelled as a mark of respect following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. That meeting was re-arranged for Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> September, after the deadline for this edition of STaB. A report of the meeting will appear in November's edition. The next meeting of the Council will take place on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> November at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.



The Parish Council was honoured to provide a Book of Condolence to enable residents to record their messages concerning the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The book was available in our parish church during the period of national mourning. In due course the messages of condolence, along with those from other Wiltshire parishes, will be sent to the Wiltshire and Swindon History Centre for the archives. A copy will also be retained in the parish.



# **Parish Council Reminders**

#### **River Clearance**

Those whose property adjoins the river are reminded that they are responsible for keeping the river clear and free flowing. During the drought, when the river was low, there was a considerable growth of weed. This, and riverbank vegetation, needs to be cut back so that the flow of the river is not reduced. If this is not done there is a risk of flooding in the village this winter.



#### **Dog Mess**



The dog population of the village seems to have increased substantially, and with it an increase in fouling of footpaths and road sides. Dog owners are reminded that it is their responsibility to pick up after their dogs and to dispose of poo bags responsibly (either in their own household waste bin or in the Wiltshire Council waste bins along the High Road).

Clearing up after your dog helps prevent the spread of some nasty infections and diseases. If you don't clear up after your dog, Community Police Officers and Wiltshire Council's Dog Warden can serve you with a fixed penalty notice; you could be prosecuted and, if found guilty, fined up to £1,000.

As the memory of those hot days and nights of the summer fade and days are shorter, the natural rhythm of life tends to mean that we spend more time indoors and perhaps less time exercising and keeping fit. But it doesn't need to be that way! All the sports clubs based at the Chalke Valley Sports Centre are open to new members and you would be made most welcome. The scheme will cost around  $\pounds$ 10,500 with grants covering a significant proportion and a contribution of  $\pounds$ 1,500 from the Tennis Club. At the time of writing, we have a couple of other grant request outstanding but hope to only have a relatively small funding gap that will require use of the sports centre's reserves. The lead in time will be several weeks so no immediate change.

# **Ebble Notes - House Martins and Intruders**

Our House Martins arrived late this year, well into May. They arrived to find that one of their last year's nests was occupied by a brood of wrens about to fledge and that the adjacent nest was being refurbished for their second brood.

The RSPB informed me that a similar thing was reported last year where a swallow's nest was used by wrens. Apparently only half of the males are monogamous, the others build more than one nest and overlap the broods.

This has been a difficult year for our house martins and for them nationally. One nest built on the other side of the house was appropriated by house sparrows. In the end we had only 5 nests built and occupied and they had all left by early August, having only had 1 brood each. Ten years ago we would have had around 14 nests occupied and 2 or more broods for each, running into September.

It seems that the hot weather has reduced the availability of flying insects, which is also bad news for the bat population



# **Recipe of the Month - Brookies**

#### By Cally Edwards

These are an easy treat for those that can't decide if they prefer a brownie or a cookie.

#### Ingredients

#### **Cookie Dough**

145g plain flour
115g light soft brown sugar
55g caster sugar
75g soft unsalted butter
1 large egg
1 large egg yolk
1/4 tsp salt
100g plain chocolate chips

# Brownie

165g dark chocolate, chopped into chips
165g fridge cold unsalted butter, chopped
330g caster sugar
3 large eggs
45g cocoa powder
120g plain flour
½ tsp baking powder
½ tsp salt

#### Method

Start by making the cookie dough as it will need 2 hours+ to freeze. You can make this in advance so it's ready when you're wanting to bake the whole thing.

#### **Cookie Dough Recipe**

Put the plain flour, light soft brown sugar, caster sugar, unsalted butter into a mixing bowl / freestanding mixer / electric hand whisk on a medium speed until it's all combined and looks like a dough. Now add the chocolate chips (plain ones ensure a not too bitter taste).

Make little walnut sized balls of this uncooked dough and place on a tray lined with baking paper that will fit into your freezer. This freezing ensures a soft chewy texture when they are combined and baked with the brownies. The dough will be sticky so you might prefer to use teaspoons to shape rather than your fingers. Once they're all on the baking tray, pop into the freezer and move onto the Brownie recipe.

#### **Brownie Recipe**

Preheat the oven to 180 degrees fan and grease and line a square 10cm x 10cm tin

Melt the dark choc and fridge cold unsalted butter together in a bowl that sits above some steaming water in a saucepan. The bowl should not touch the water, but allow the butter and choc chips to melt together. Give it several stirs to help it on its way. Once the butter and choc chips are thoroughly melted and combined, take the bowl off the heat and leave to one side whilst you carry on with the other ingredients. The chocolate and butter mixture needs to be cool enough (not cold, but more like room temp) to add to the brownie mixture so it doesn't cook the eggs before baking.

Beat the eggs and sugar until you have a whipped and pale combination (3-5 mins medium speed). Now add the melted chocolate butter mixture and mix again briefly until combined.

Sift all the dry ingredients: cocoa powder, plain flour, baking powder, salt over the top of the brownie mixture and mix again. You can fold it by hand with a spoon if you'd rather but a whip will work as long as it's on a low speed and brings the whole brownie cake mixture together. The whole thing should now look thick, sticky and intense. Pour this brownie mixture into the square tin and level out so it is evenly spread.

#### Time to Combine

Take the frozen cookie dough balls out of the freezer and dot them inside the brownie mixture. There should be spaces in between them. You're going to want to push the cookie dough balls into the brownie mix; ensuring they are nestled in and evenly but thoroughly spread. If the dough balls seem too big or small, simply break off / cut to size. I find that I have a few cookie dough balls left over - great for another bake (store in the freezer) or simply bake them as a cookie.

Place the square tin into your pre-heated oven at 180 degree C (fan) for 20-22 mins. You want them to come out with the brownie fudgy. As they cool down in the tin, they should gently keep cooking but retain their fudginess.



# Sarah's Gardening Tips for October

- 1. Plant garlic now for harvest next summer.
- 2. Plant hedges, move trees and shrubs as required.
- 3. Protect half hardy plants with fleece or bring them into a greenhouse.
- 4. Harvest pumpkins and squashes before the first frost as they will quickly go mushy.
- 5. Plant spring flowering bulbs.
- 6. Take hardwood cutting from deciduous shrubs.
- 7. Wrap grease bands around the trunks of apple trees to trap winter moth females whose caterpillars shred spring flowers.
- 8. Divide congested rhubarb by digging up and splitting.
- 9. Lift and divide any herbaceous perennials while the soil is still warm.

# Local Charity News and Events



#### **CRESS FUNDED CLINIC IN NORTHERN UGANDA**

Northern Uganda is one of the remaining pockets of global systemic poverty. Most of the community in which we work live under the \$2 a day mark and lacks basic infrastructure and resources. That is why it is nearly impossible for the Ugandan government to address the basic needs of the 1.4 million South

Sudanese refugees who have fled to the area and why CRESS has stepped in opening and operating a Primary Health Care Clinic, Jehovah Rapa, which in 2021 saw over 12,000 patients and over 200 births. It provides treatment for malaria, pneumonia, diarrhoea, diabetes, mellitus, hypertension, typhoid, brucellosis and other skin conditions. In addition, the clinic also provides vital pre and post-natal care . The CRESS clinic provides the most advanced services in a 3 hour radius and is the only urgent care option. The clinic works alongside the nearest government health centre to provide more advanced care.

# WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE CLINIC Field Midwife

The clinic has appointed a new field midwife Nsimenta Asaba who joined the clinic team in May. Asaba is dividing her time between the Mijale Clinic maternity work helping the midwife Bethy, who delivered 218 babies single-handedly in 2021, and also work in the refugee camps where there is no maternal health support. In the camps she has already begun teaching about hygiene, family spacing, correct use of a mosquito net and maternity classes. As well as helping deliver some babies.

#### **Eye Surgery**


In June eye screening was carried out by eye doctors from Arua hospital, they travelled out to Mijale, some 100 kilometres away. They screened 234 patients. 43 patients were recommended to have glasses and others were seen with trachoma, degenerative diseases, allergies and glaucoma. Surgery was undertaken in July on 63 cataracts and 4 eye lids. The glasses were also given to their owners over the summer.



# **Police Bulletin**

A new monthly newsletter from Philip Wilkinson, Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire.



I've now been 'in the job' of PCC for a year, and if there is one thing that's been made abundantly clear to me, it's that your confidence in policing is not where I want it to be.

Whilst there are clearly some exceptional individual officers, overall, there have been gaps in the service you receive. In the past year, I have taken practical steps to address them, such as the purchasing of effective technology such as drones and ensuring more officers are deployed to the rural crime team.

The damage done by crimes such as hare coursing, criminal damage and theft have a massive impact on the rural community and history shows that at times of recession, farms become targets.

I regularly speak to farmers and I'm all too aware of the reasons why you feel that reporting crime is not worthwhile. In my Police and Crime Plan, I've committed to ensure Wiltshire Police takes these crimes seriously and deals with them effectively.

This is why l've taken steps to ensure the rural crime team has the capabilities and staffing it needs.

As part of this commitment, Wiltshire Police has introduced online crime reporting specifically for rural crime. The form takes about ten minutes and is picked up by the same people who answer 101 calls.

It's vital that to build up an overall picture and identify patterns of criminal activity, all crime is reported, no matter how small it may seem.

As this has only recently been introduced, I welcome your feedback about how the system is working. It's only through working together that we can stop these crimes from happening and make Wiltshire a safer place to live and work.
