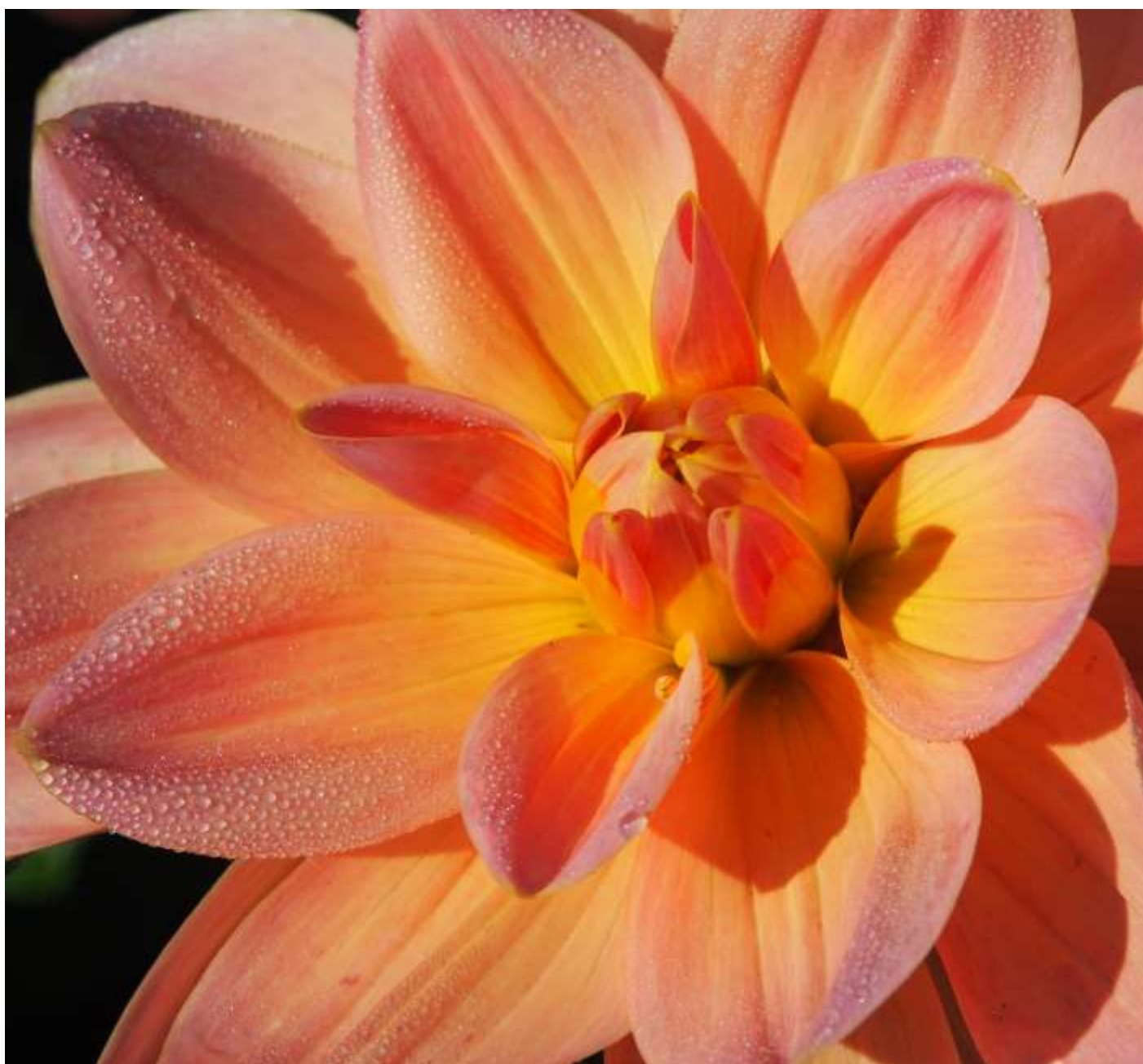

Bishopstone Parish Council

The latest meeting of the Parish Council took place on Thursday 12th September 2024. Councillors Edwards, Barter, Smith and Rigg were present, together with the Parish Clerk. Apologies had been received from Cllrs Thorne, Cllr Tatner, Wiltshire Councillor Nabil Najjar and PCSO Charlotte King. The meeting was also attended by Michael Pratt (Tree Warden) and two members of the public. The full minutes of the meeting are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk).

PCSO Charlotte King was unable to attend the meeting, but had sent a written report. The increased presence of the Police in the village was noted and it was agreed to send a message of thanks. Many elderly residents who had suffered from recent anti-social behaviour were now more reassured.



Mike Ash reported the welcome news that, following the long campaign by the Parish Council, it now appeared that Wiltshire Council is prepared to extend the existing 30mph speed limit on Broad Chalke Road to the section past the Recreation Field, Play Area and the White Hart. As

previously reported in STaB, consultants appointed by Wiltshire Council had recommended against any change to the existing 40mph limit. However, the matter has been reconsidered by the Wiltshire Cabinet Member for Highways following further representations by the Parish Council. He has indicated that he now supports the proposal to reduce the limit to 30mph. A final decision has yet to be taken but, once it has, the next step will be the necessary legal steps under Traffic Regulation Order procedures and consideration of funding for the work involved.

Mike Ash said that he had also raised with Wiltshire Council Highways the need to improve safety at the junction of Portfield Road and the High Road. In August a car travelling down Portfield Road had failed to stop at the junction and been buried in the front room of a cottage on the opposite side of the road. Luckily the occupants of the house were elsewhere and the driver, though taken to hospital, was not badly hurt. However, there had been extensive damage to the property. It is considered unlikely that Wiltshire will agree to any change to the speed limit on Portfield Road, but it was felt that there is a need to improve the warning signs relating to the junction. It was agreed to submit proposals to Wiltshire's Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group.



Michael Pratt reported that he had submitted a grant application on behalf of the Parish Council for a "Coronation Living Heritage Orchard". This is a Wiltshire Council initiative to encourage the planting of community orchards to mark the



coronation of King Charles III. It is proposed to plant 12 trees (a mixture of apples, pears and plums) in an area beside the Children's Play Area on the Recreation Field. Any fruit produced once the trees have matured will be free to be picked by anyone in the village. The work of establishing the orchard will be led by the village's Tree Wardens (Michael Pratt and Georgie Phillips)

but it will be important for others to volunteer to help with planting and future maintenance. It might also be possible to engage local schools in this project. The costs of this project, once approved, will be met by Wiltshire Council.

The Council thanked Cllr Ali Thorne, in his absence, for the action he had taken to remove the graffiti that had been sprayed on to the climbing tower in the Children's Play Area. Similar graffiti had been sprayed on the river side of the bridge over the Ebbles in Faulston Lane. The Clerk had asked Wiltshire Council to remove this but had been told that it wasn't a priority as it was neither obscene nor offensive. Subsequently Cllr Thorne had agreed that he would see whether he could remove it.

The need for landowners to clear drainage ditches and dead trees was discussed – see separate note in this STaB. The Council also approved annual grants of £800 to the Parochial Church Council and £350 to the Chalke Valley Sports Centre.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday 14th November at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

Winter is Coming

Sorry to remind everyone, but winter weather is just around the corner and there is a need to make sure that the river and drainage ditches are clear, so that flooding is avoided, and that dead trees are removed before they can fall and block roads or footpaths.

If your garden or field is either crossed by, or adjoins, a watercourse – anything from the river to the smallest ditch – you are responsible for keeping it clear so that the flow of water is not impeded. There are some large areas of weed in the river and several important drainage ditches in the village are overgrown. Please take action now to clear these so that they do not contribute to flooding incidents this winter.



The effects of Ash die-back can be seen throughout the village. These, and any other dead trees, need to be removed, particularly if they are near a road or footpath. If a tree falls and causes injury the landowner may be liable. Roads are regularly blocked by fallen trees causing great inconvenience. Whilst we are grateful to the volunteers in the village who turn out to help when this happens we should not have to rely on them.

Bishopstone Village Hall has 2 rooms that are available for hire for a wide range of functions. The larger room is ideal for children's parties with lots of space for running around. It can also accommodate wedding receptions, charity functions and large family celebrations.

The smaller room (The Memorial Room) is a good size for meetings and smaller gatherings.

The modern kitchen is spacious and fully equipped with an electric catering range, a professional 4 minute dishwasher, water boiler, hot cupboard, microwave oven, 2 fridges and a freezer, all suitable for professional caterers. There is also glassware, crockery and cutlery for over 80 people.

Staying in Touch

STaB magazine is a vital source of communication in the village, keeping everyone informed as to what is happening locally. However, the Covid-19 pandemic has highlighted the fact that situations can change very rapidly. To keep up to date with what is going on there are two other important sources of information in Bishopstone - the village website and our own WhatsApp network.

The village website – www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk is updated in real time and carries all the latest news on issues that affect the village.



The Bishopstone Network is a WhatsApp messaging service that has more than proved its worth during the pandemic, and more recently during the storms when residents were able to report fallen trees and blocked roads to the Emergency Planning Officer. Information can be instantly shared to your mobile phone about support services being provided in the village and on a variety of other matters – everything from the length of electricity black outs to what is available from the White Hart take-away service! Salisbury Foodbank

First of all I must apologise for not mentioning a £20 cash donation received for July, I did take it to the foodbank but forgot to put it in my report.

Last month I had a £10 cash donation plus 10.4 kgs of food and then this month there was a donation of 4.2kgs and of course the Harvest donations, of which I have no idea the amount as I was away from home that weekend.

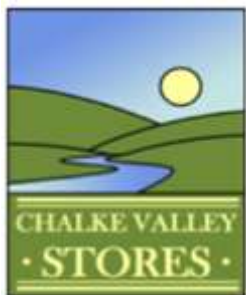

Remembrance Sunday - 10th November 2024

The Service of Remembrance will be held once again at the Church at **1050 a.m. on Sunday 10th November**. We remember the 27 from Bishopstone and 5 from Stratford Tony lost in both wars. It is also eighty years since the D-Day Landings (Operation Overlord) on the beaches of Normandy, magnificently commemorated this year in France and England.

Please be seated by 1045 hrs, for the two-minute silence **at 1100 hrs**. The service will be led by our own Revd Canon Jenny Taylor and will follow the usual running order. The Names of the Fallen from the memorial tablet and those buried in the graveyards of Bishopstone and Stratford Tony will be recited, the Remembrance Wreath will be laid, there will be readings and recitations suitable for the occasion led by ex-service members of our community, and rousing hymns and prayers.

After the service, a traditional curry lunch will be available at **The White Hart from about 1230hrs**. If you want to come and join the veterans and others, please **ring Tom or Zara at the White Hart (780244)**, to reserve places. The cost will be £14 per head, and please remember to pay for the curry and any drinks before you leave!

We look forward to an outstanding turnout of veterans and friends of all ages from the village. Everyone is welcome to both service and lunch, of whatever age, and ex-service personnel are asked to wear their medals, regimental or corps ties etc!

So our last thank you is to all of you who came along and supported us.

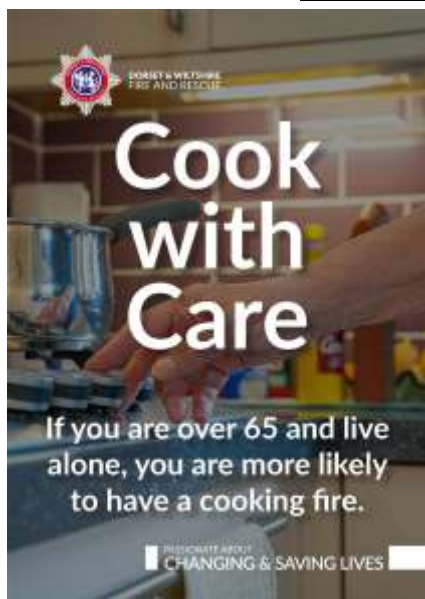

Cook with Care Campaign



During 2023, one third of the kitchen fires attended by Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service (DWFRS) were in the homes of people aged over 65 and living alone. To combat this alarming statistic, DWFRS is launching a new safety campaign, with a focus on preventing cooking-related incidents and making residents safer at home.

'Cook with Care' has four key themes to help reduce kitchen fires:

- **Prepare** - Before you start cooking, create a clear space to prepare your meals safely. Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob, and take care if you're wearing loose clothing.
- **Prevent** - Never put anything other than pots and pans on your cooker hob; even after you've finished cooking, the hob will remain hot for some time. Never put anything metal into the microwave. Saucepan handles left sticking out create a danger; there's a risk they could be caught, leading to the pans being knocked off the hob.
- **Focus** - Don't leave cooking unattended. Avoid cooking if you are tired, have been drinking alcohol or are taking medication that leaves you drowsy.
- **Stay Safe** - Keep the oven, hob and grill clean as a build-up of fat or grease can catch fire when hot. Switch off the oven and/or hob when you have finished cooking and take pans off the heat.

It's vital that we do all we can to protect our communities, especially those people who are perhaps more vulnerable because of their age or where they live. By highlighting some of the potential dangers in the kitchen, DWFRS hope to encourage safer cooking behaviours amongst those most at risk.

Notes from a Nutritionist by Amber Cotton Nutrition

Welcome to my October recipe. This month I've chosen a gorgeous tomato soup recipe by the chef Nathan Outlaw as it's a brilliant way to use up the final glut of tomatoes, or to make use of the slightly over-ripe ones in the shops. It also makes a great pasta sauce: just reduce the amount of stock by half, and it freezes well.

Nathan Outlaw's Tomato Soup

Serves 6

Ingredients

1.5kg ripe tomatoes
Olive oil for cooking
2 red onions, peeled and chopped
4 garlic cloves, peeled and chopped
2 celery sticks, chopped
2 sprigs of rosemary
4 salted anchovies
1 litre chicken or vegetable stock
1 tbsp capers
6 tbsp crème fraîche
Sea salt and ground pepper

To finish

Extra virgin olive oil to drizzle
Sprig of rosemary or chopped chives

Method

Preheat oven to 200°C/Fan 185°C, Gas 6.

Halve the tomatoes and lay them on a baking tray. Season with salt and pepper then drizzle with olive oil. Roast in the oven for about 40 minutes until the tomatoes are softened and beginning to colour.

Halfway through the tomatoes cooking time, heat a large saucepan over a medium heat and add a drizzle of olive oil. When hot, add the onion, garlic, celery, rosemary and anchovies and cook slowly for 10 minutes until the vegetables are really soft. Add the stock and bring to the boil.

When the tomatoes are ready, add them to the pan, along with any juices. Simmer for 20 minutes then add the capers, and season with pepper to taste.

Transfer the soup to a freestanding blender, or use a stick blender, and blitz until smooth. Add the crème fraîche and blend for another minute. Pour into a clean pan, bring back to a simmer and taste for seasoning.

Serve with a drizzle of extra virgin olive oil and a sprinkling of chopped herbs.

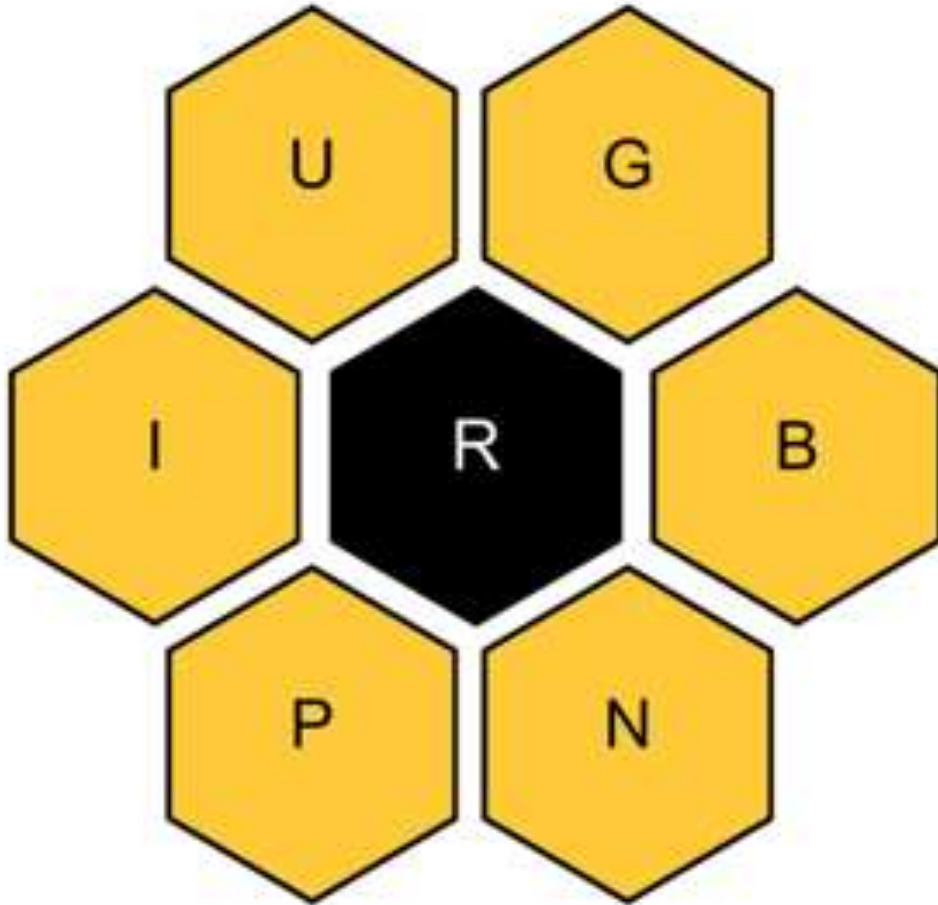

In the next few weeks, you will see my proposal for a new Police and Crime Plan 2024-2028.

I have taken your feedback from the many responses I received as part of the public consultation conducted in July, where you told me about the areas of policing which matter most to you, your thoughts on the service provided by Wiltshire Police and, crucially, whether you feel safer in your community compared to when I first took office in 2021.

It's vitally important to acknowledge that whilst reviews and statistics may show an improved performance by Wiltshire Police, the real impact we need to make is for our residents in Wiltshire and Swindon to feel safer in their daily lives.

This is why I'm looking for your opinions on the Police and Crime Plan, as it will set the framework and strategic direction for Wiltshire Police, as well as making it clear how you will see that the force is making progress in the areas where you want to see improvements being made.

As well as taking into account your feedback, the plan will also incorporate the requirements required by His Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Services (HMICFRS) as part its Police Effectiveness, Efficiency and Legitimacy (PEEL) report, national priorities and emerging local priorities such as rural crime and retail crime.

Whilst improvements have been made with regards to policing in Wiltshire since I drew up my first Police and Crime Plan in 2021, I must stress that there is more work to do across key areas within the force, and the Chief Constable is aware of my expectations and shares my belief that the updated Police and Crime Plan needs to reflect our joint commitment to making Wiltshire a safer place to live and work.

By giving me your considered thoughts and opinions on my updated Police and Crime Plan, you will help me to create a document by which the performance of Wiltshire Police and my office can be judged.

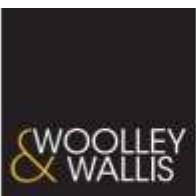

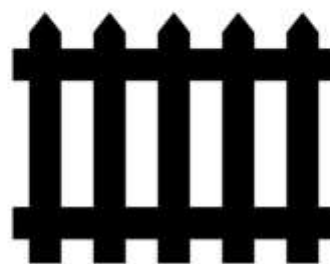

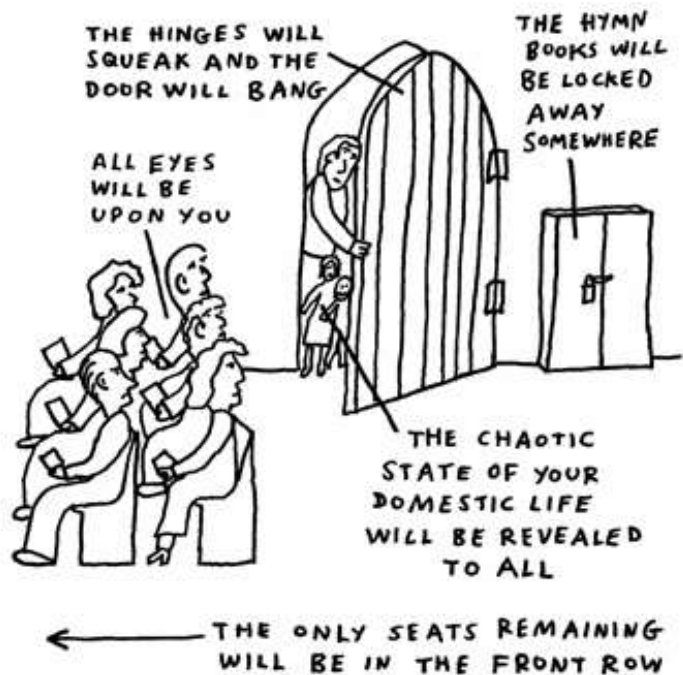
