Parish Council

A meeting of Bishopstone Parish Council took place on Thursday 8th July in the Village Hall with Covid-19 safety precautions in place. Full minutes of the meeting, together with the papers considered, are available on the village website <u>www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk</u>. Wiltshire Councillor Nabil Najjar attended the meeting, as did three members of the public.

The Chairman, Cllr Gibbon, welcomed Wiltshire Councillor Najjar to his first meeting in Bishopstone. Cllr Najjar said he had been delighted to be elected to the Fovant and Chalke Valley Division and to have been made Portfolio Holder for Arts, Heritage and Tourism. He said that he would focus very strongly on representing the Division on Wiltshire Council and was pleased to have already been involved in helping secure a major grant from the South West Area Board for the Chalke Valley Sports Centre. He said that he would try to attend as many parish council meetings as possible, though with some 16 parishes in his Division this might not always be possible. He expressed his appreciation for all the work that his predecessor, Cllr Jose Green, had undertaken over many years.

Fire in Stanley Close. Cllr Gibbon expressed the Council's appreciation for the way in which the village had rallied round to help deal with the fire itself and its aftermath. This had been outstanding. Efforts to establish the location of fire hydrants in the village were reported in the June edition of STaB. The request for help in checking locations had, so far, produced no response. Keeping hydrants clear of undergrowth was important and the hydrant involved in the Stanley Close incident was already again invisible from the road. Once locations had been identified a map would be included in the village Emergency Plan. It was suggested that an "adopt a hydrant" scheme might be launched to encourage residents to keep their nearest hydrant visible.

Consideration was given to the future of the **Speed Indicator Device**. The existing unit is in need of repair or replacement. This unit had been shared with Broad Chalke Council but they have decided to purchase one for their sole use. It was decided to replace the existing unit with a slightly smaller one, which will make handling easier. This would be for the sole use of Bishopstone, which will enable it to be deployed more frequently.

The Council approved a policy for a **Minor Works Programme** to enable expenditure to be approved between meetings to meet the costs incurred by volunteers and contractors in undertaking small tasks of repair and maintenance in the village.

Work on installing the new play equipment in the **Children's Play Area** had been completed and reports from users were positive. Having installed new equipment

for slightly older children it was agreed that consideration should be given to how to make additional provision for the very youngest children. Further work will also be undertaken on options for **planting trees** on the northern edge of the Recreation Field as a contribution to the "Green Canopy" project to mark the Queen's Jubilee next year.

A short update was provided on the Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) project, where good progress was being made. This project is reported on elsewhere in STaB.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday 9th September at 7.00pm in the Village Hall.

Covid-19 Update in Bishopstone

Whilst Covid 19 related legal restrictions have been lifted, it remains important to follow the Government's guidance to keep each other safe. The number of infections is increasing and you may be required to self isolate, even if you are double jabbed.

Self-isolate immediately if:

- you have any symptoms of COVID-19 (a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste)
- you've tested positive for COVID-19 this means you have the virus
- someone you live with has symptoms or tested positive
- you've been told you've been in contact with someone who tested positive or been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or the NHS COVID-19 app
- you have arrived in England from abroad (not including Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or other parts of the UK)

If you are self isolating you should not leave home. Do not:

- go to work, school or public places work from home if you can
- go on public transport or use taxis
- go out to get food and medicine order it online or by phone, or ask someone to bring it to your home (see below)
- have visitors in your home, including friends and family except for people providing essential care
- go out to exercise exercise at home or in your garden, if you have one

If you need help – with supplies of shopping, prescription collection etc - and you cannot arrange this with friends or family, please phone 01722 781044 and arrangements will be made through the volunteers that helped earlier in the pandemic.

Volunteering at the hub


We are on the lookout for more volunteers to join the friendly team at The Hub. Please come and talk to Tony if you could volunteer a few hours.

Bishopstone Ultrafast Broadband Update



GREAT NEWS! The Bishopstone FTTP Project Team have received a firm quote from Openreach to install a fibre network in the western half of Bishopstone village. This will allow nearly all properties there to have an Ultrafast Broadband connection. Their quote was well below the value of the Government vouchers we will receive from the properties who have expressed

an interest in having FTTP, so we have accepted it. The process to install the network has therefore formally started.

What Happens Next?

Our website has the full process but here are the next steps:

If you have expressed an interest, you will shortly be contacted by the Project Team and asked to confirm that we can send your personal data to Openreach. You will then receive an email from the DCMS asking to confirm you want an FTTP connection AND you will take out a new fibre contract with the ISP of your choice when the installation of the network is completed. Your Government voucher will then be activated. Once enough vouchers have been activated Openreach will begin installation work.

If you have not expressed an interest (see our website for the list of properties who have) then let us know **NOW**. This is your last chance to have your property connected to the network and all the advantages that will bring to you.

trip round the garden. I feel very privileged that we have hedgehogs in the garden, and hope our neighbours enjoy them too!

The Village is looking very prosperous and very clean, apart from some dogs leaving their dirt behind. It is a nuisance and foul smelling, so please pick them up. The dog can't do it, so the handler should. Please remember others. The brambles are thriving, and we should have a good hedgerow harvest in September. Thanks to the PC for the new and smooth covering on Portfield Road. At last we have a decent surface.

The church was full again last Sunday, and we hope to be able to sing out loud soon. There was definite sound of singing last week, even under masks! On 11th July, a large crowd of about 150 suitably spaced folk said farewell to Revd Anna-Claar at Nunton. It was a wonderful open-air service in the churchyard led by her and Revd Catherine. Ebble Notes - Mainly Birds, Summer 2021

This has been a bad year for some birds. Blue tits in particular have suffered, as those fans of Springwatch have seen. They will also have heard that in the UK in a normal year they and their offspring would consume 35 billion caterpillars/ larvae, however in 2021 when most birds laid their eggs at the normal time, there was not enough food. The cold and wet conditions in a lot of the country stopped the development of the food source, so many chicks have died. However, in our garden, there was a frost virtually every night until 8th May and the night time temperature only just went over 5 deg. twice in the rest of the month and our blue tits did not nest until June. The great tits were not so careful and their nest was abandoned.

Five degrees or below at night is significant, as few plants, even grass grow much under those conditions. Consequently insects do not lay eggs either, waiting for the fresh softer new growth. The lack of rain in April and May held back growth and led to brown patches on our lawn and blackbirds struggling to get worms.

We did see a solitary house martin return in April, with more returning at times during May and June. This late return has been mirrored across the UK. Cold weather across southern Europe is thought to have been the cause. At the moment we have 6 occupied nests, down 2 on last year, however the first to lay had chicks hatch on June 18th which happened to be very wet all day. Over the next days they continued to feed, so it was not a disaster.

Whilst in a Conservation Area in Cranborne Chase and despite otters returning, we have seen a significant decline in the numbers and variety of birds, mammals (including voles, hedgehogs, bats and deer), butterflies and wild flowers over the past 10 years. Pheasant breeding may have contributed to this decline, maybe it is a symptom and maybe it is coincidental, but the change seems real.

This year CRESS is specifically looking to raise funds towards the purchase of a 4x4 vehicle, costing ca £20,000, so that CRESS health support workers and fully trained Children's Accelerated Trauma Training (CATT) counsellors can provide the range of clinical services to refugees living in the different refugee camps across northern Uganda. Without a 4x4 vehicle it is impossible to travel on the uneven and often deeply rutted roads to deliver necessary medicines and supplies to those in need. For example, CRESS supplies antenatal classes and Mama Kits to improve the birth outcomes for pregnant mothers.

Recipe of the Month - Blackberry and Apple Curd

By Kate Pendlenton

Looking ahead to blackberry and apple season, this is a lovely way to take advantage of both these seasonal fruits.

Makes 450g/1lb (one large jar)

Ingredients

175g blackberries
1 large cooking apple, peeled, cored and sliced
Juice of half a lemon
50g butter
225g granulated sugar
2 eggs



Method

Put the blackberries and sliced apple into a saucepan and heat gently until the juices run and the fruit is soft.

Sieve and put the fruit puree in a bowl above a pan of simmering water with the lemon juice, butter and sugar.

Stir until the butter melts and the sugar dissolves.

Beat the eggs and stir into the fruit mixture.


Cook gently, stirring often, until the curd thickens.

Strain through a sieve (optional, but gives a really smooth curd) and spoon into a warm sterilised jar.


This curd keeps in the fridge for 2-3 weeks. Use it on toast, to fill a sponge cake or as a topping for ice-cream.





Sarah's Gardening Tips for August and September

- 1. Keep dead-heading annuals so they continue flowering and don't go to seed.
- 2. Water evergreen shrubs like camelias and rhododendrons thoroughly to make sure that next year's buds develop.
- 3. Trim lavender after flowering to keep them compact.
- 4. Mow meadows now to help scatter established wildflower seeds.
- 5. Prune climbing and rambling roses now if they have finished flowering but not if they are repeat flowering, wait until after they finish.
- 6. Harvest second early potatoes now.
- 7. Pinch out the tips of runner bean plants to stop them growing above the supports. Keep feeding them with tomato feed.
- 8. Prune the fruited stems of blackcurrant bushes after harvesting.
- 9. Cut back the fruited canes of summer raspberries, leaving the new green canes for next year's crop. Tie in next year's canes to support wires.


