Broadchalke Surgery

As from the 1st of July the Broadchalke Surgery will be closed every Monday Afternoon from 1-6.30pm NHS England are cutting the funding for Phlebotomy Service (Blood service) and in order to keep this service running we have had to take this step. Over the course of the last two months we have been monitoring the usage of the surgeries at both Sixpenny Handley and Broadchalke and closure on Monday at Broadchalke would seem to cause the least disruption.

As with Tuesday afternoons in Sixpenny Handley and Wednesdays in Broadchalke the GP's will be working normally are available until 6.30pm when all phone calls are directed tp the out of hours' service 111. The Sixpenny Handley site will remain open on Mondays for surgeries by appointment only and collections of medications until 8.30pm

A guide to your rights and responsibilities of riverside ownership

RIVERSIDE LANDOWNERS

At this time of year there is considerable growth of weeds and other plants along the banks of the many watercourses through the village. This is just a reminder of your responsibility as a "riparian landowner".

The Environment Agency guide says:

"You should keep the banks clear of anything that could cause an obstruction and increase flood risk, either on your land or downstream if it is washed away. You are responsible for maintaining the bed and banks of the watercourse and the trees and shrubs growing on the banks." Please take care, when removing natural growth, not to disturb wildlife and not to allow cut material to float downstream where it may cause an obstruction to river flow.






