Hello from the Revd Jenny Taylor

June can be the most glorious month with our Valley looking at its most beautiful. Our spirits and our hearts are raised in joyful thank fulness to be living in such a beautiful part of God's creation. Even if the weather does not live up to expectations we have a great celebration to look forward to – that of the Queen's official birthday. The weekend of 11th/12th June looks to be amazing! Bish Bash on

Saturday and an uplifting, vibrant church service on Sunday - do check the timings of all the events so you don't miss anything.

Our Queen's dedication to her life of serving her country is so well-documented that you certainly do not need me to remind you of it! But it does not do any of us any harm to think about her example, about her life of service and then to ask ourselves what we can do for our communities, our churches, our friends and families. Her Christian faith lies at the very core of her life and this might be just the time to ask ourselves about our own faith and perhaps investigate things a little more. Why not come to a church service near you – "taste and see" as it is written in the Psalms?

As we celebrate a life of prayer, of service and of dedication it seemed fitting to us as a clergy team that we look at our own prayer life together. As you are probably aware we try to meet three times a week for Evening Prayer; we still are going to at Broad Chalke on a Tuesday and Coombe Bissett on a Thursday at 5.00 pm but we are now going to add in on Wednesdays, a Holy Communion service at 12.15 in Bishopstone, starting from July 20th. If you find it difficult to come to church on Sundays for all sorts of reasons perhaps this service is for you? It will last between 20 and 30 minutes and everyone is most welcome.

Another service which is always popular is our Choral Evensong at Stratford Tony on July 3rd – it will be lovely to see you there and enjoy tea with you afterwards at Manor Farm House. That service begins another exciting month in the life of our church so keep any eye open for the following:

July 10th: Animal Service – 3.00p.m.

July 17^{th:} Dedication of our Nave Altar – 9.30a.m.

July 31^{st:} Benefice Service 10.00a.m.

So have a wonderful June, celebrate joyfully the 90th birthday of our Queen, look forward to July and take some time to reflect on Psalm 34:

e Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council took place on 12th May the Village Hall. Many thanks to all those who attended.

s meeting marked the retirement of Major James Thompson as a uncillor and as Chairman of the Council, a post that he has held for the t six years. He thanked his fellow Councilor's, and all who contribute village life, for their help in making Bishopstone a wonderful place to . Mike Ash, on behalf of the Council, thanked James for all that he d done, and the leadership he had provided, and presented him with a canter (and a bottle of something to go in it) as an expression of inks. We hope James will still occasionally look in at future meetings — to make sure we are up to the mark!

Councillor John Gibbon was elected as Chairman of the Council for the coming year, with Councillor Ali Thorne continuing as Vice Chairman. Marion Foster was co-opted to fill the Councillor vacancy created by Major Thompson's retirement. A full note on the matters discussed at the meeting is available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.com). It was agreed to:

- mark the Queen's reign with a new bench in the village, rather than a tree.
- put forward a proposal to the Community Area Transport Group for a proper pavement to be provided on the south side of the High Road between Meadow View and Whitlock Rise.
- draw attention to the provisions of the Countryside and Highway Codes and to ask dog owners and horse riders to observe them.
- meet the cost of skip hire to dispose of rubbish collected after the Bish Bash Summer Extravaganza on 11th June.
- investigate further the provision of an Automated External Defibrillator in the village.
- carry out another "litter pick" before 11th June.

An update was given on discussions with Wiltshire Council of various issues concerning Whitlock Rise. Mike Ash said he was now hopeful that it would be possible for an access to be provided from the car park to the High Road. It was agreed to ask the Council to remind their tenants of the need for children not to run across other people's front gardens.

The new Play Tower in the Children's Play Area is now fully installed and is apparently much appreciated by the village toddlers! It is hoped, subject to the weather, to complete the repainting of the Play Train before the 11th June.

The considerable success of the Community Speed Watch in reducing speeding through the village was noted. **However**, this was thanks to the dedication of a very small group of volunteers. **ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEERS ARE DESPARATELY NEEDED** – please do your bit and contact Councillor John Gibbon on 01722 718551.

The proposal for a "circular walk", using footpaths in the village, has been accepted as part of a Wiltshire Council South West Board project to promote short walks that will appeal to visitors. Wiltshire Council will be publishing guidance leaflets (which will note local points of interest) and special waymarks and signing. It was agreed that the main sign to the walk should be on the High Road close to the pub – which will hopefully benefit from this project.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Thursday 14 $^{\rm th}$ July at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. All are welcome to attend.

Traffic Control

Bishopstone House wall repairs.

There will be control traffic lights on the valley road by the turning to Wilton, whilst repairs are carried out on the roadside wall. Works started on Thursday 19th May . The work will last about 5 / 6 weeks (they are hoping to be finished by the week of the Chalke Valley History

Festival). Whilst it is a necessary inconvenience to us all it is a safety requirement. Please leave a little more time to get up and down the valley?

RESPECT – PROTECT – ENJOY

The Countryside Code



e failure of many in the village to observe the Countryside Code. The full rsion of the Code is now available on the Village website www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk) but key points are: spect the needs of local people and visitors alike – for example, don't ock gateways, driveways or other paths with your vehicle. nen driving a vehicle or riding a bike, slow down or stop for horses, walkers and farm animals and give them plenty of room.

- co-operate with people at work in the countryside keep out of the way when farm animals are being gathered or moved and follow directions from the farmer.
- stick to the footpath.
- take your litter home with you litter doesn't just spoil the beauty of the countryside, it can be dangerous to wildlife and farm animals.
- keep dogs under effective control ensure your dog does not disturb wildlife, farm animals, horses or other people. Keep your dog on a lead or in sight at all times, be aware of what it's doing and be confident it will return to you promptly on command.
- always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly –' bag it and bin it'.

Horse riders are also reminded of the need to observe the **Highway Code**. In particular, when riding on the road you should keep to the left and keep any horse you are leading to your left. Never ride more than two abreast, and ride in single file on narrow or busy roads and when riding round bends. You **MUST NOT** take a horse onto a footpath or pavement - use a bridleway.

PLANT STALL AT SPRING FAYRE






SAFARI SUPPER

DID YOU KNOW FROM THE CHURCH

Ours is probably the best and smallest 'cathedral' in the Chalke Valley! It is the only church built in a crucifix layout, with probably the narrowest nave! However, it was built at about the same time as the Cathedral of Sarum, and is much appreciated by our many visitors.



So go along and have a look in the south transept to see the stained glass panels in all their glory. They lived for many years out of sight in the northeast corner of the vestry, not open to the public.


After their relocation last year by the glaziers of the Cathedral, you can enjoy the 14th century panel of St Peter with his book, but what in his left hand .. hardly his keys? The lower portion is 18th and 19th century renovation, which gave him 2 left feet, possibly of 14thC glass!

It was the NADFAS Church Recording Team, under Anne Stutchbury who discovered the name of the chap in the memorial on the west wall of the north transept!! It is high up; he is in clerical garb, and he is the Rev Abraham Conham.

He was Rector of Bishopstone from 1548 to 1612, but also Rector of Gussage St Michael, and a prebendary of the cathedrals in Salisbury, Wells and Lincoln. He must have been a busy man!! Have a good look, and note his dress, the ruff and the cap, the bag of gold (?) in his hand, and the family crest of a bird on a serpent above his right shoulder.

There are printed guides to the church history, post-cards for sale, and don't forget to sign the visitors' book before you leave.

Caring is part of being human and at the heart of family life. As our population ages and people live longer, often with complex health conditions, more and more of us will find ourselves caring with 3 in 5 of us becoming carers at some point in our lives.

A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who cannot manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.

Many people don't identify themselves as carers, they feel they are just doing what anyone else would so they don't always know what support is available to them.

Carer Support Wiltshire is a local charity supporting carers in Wiltshire. They help them to access support, services, education and training, and breaks from their caring role. As part of Carers Week (6th-12th June) they will be celebrating the contribution unpaid carers make to families and communities in Wiltshire with their Walk a Mile in My Shoes sponsored walk. Walkers are encouraged to decorate their trainers or swap shoes with a relative or friend and show their support for carers. The walk will take place at John Coles Park in Chippenham. Latest Government Initiative

The Department of Health has stipulated that from March 2016 all patients should have a named GP. They hope that by doing this patients will be reassured that there is someone at the Practice who has overall responsibility for their health. By doing this it is thought that there will be less chance of differing opinion creating delays in treatment, or worse still falling completely through the net. This doesn't change the way that you can get an appointment to see a GP, nor will it stop you seeing a different GP on different occasions. If you would like to know who your named GP is please ask when you are next contacting the surgery. The receptionists will be able to tell you. If you would rather have someone else, then please drop us a brief note stating your name, date of birth, first line of address and who you would like as your named GP. We will amend your records accordingly.

Out of Hours Primary Care Paediatric Service

This is running from 6pm to 10pm, Monday to Friday, and 4pm to 8pm, Saturdays and Sundays. The purpose of the pilot is to provide an alternative to A&E for parents with unwell children. The timing of the pilot opening hours has been matched with peaks in A&E attendance to maximise the potential for this pilot to show benefits in a reduction in inappropriate A&E attendances of children into SFT. The focus of this pilot is very much as an extension of GP services but exclusively for children and at times when there is demand but GP surgeries are closed.

Patient Participation Group

We have a Patient Participation Group which runs currently on a virtual footing. We send regular but infrequent emails asking for comment and advice on potential changes to the Practice. We would like to have more members of this group representing all sections of the Practice, including those people who seldom visit us.
