BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on Thursday 9th January. Sixteen villagers attended. The full minutes of the meeting are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk). The main issues considered were:

flooding. A number of houses in the village were badly affected by flooding over Christmas and the New Year. Criticisms were raised about the preparedness of the Parish Council to deal with the problem. It was pointed out that the primary responsibility for preventing damage to property lay with homeowners. The Parish Council had co-ordinated the provision of sand and sandbags for use by those unable to help themselves and had pressed Wiltshire Council for roads to be closed where the flooding was worst. However, it was agreed that a formal Emergency Plan needed to be put in place and a meeting held to discuss this (see separate notice in this STaB).

the White Hart pub. The application had been submitted for the pub to be included on the list of "assets of community value" under the Localism Act. This would mean that should the owners wish to dispose of the building for a use other than as a pub the community in Bishopstone would have 6 months to mount a bid to buy it. A decision by Wiltshire Council on whether to list the pub will be made by 7th February.

basketball on the Recreation Field. Funding has now been secured for a practice basketball court to be provided on the Recreation Field. This follows a request from a number of young people in the village. There will be a small area of hard surfacing together with a single basketball post, backboard, ring and net.

Mac's Meadow. The field in Church Lane/Mill Lane has been acquired by Mr Robert Jones, who lives in the village. He has indicated that the riverside will be reserved for fishing, but the rest of the meadow will remain available, as previously, to be enjoyed by the village. He hoped to encourage the wildflower content of the meadow. New guidelines on the use of the meadow are being agreed and will be available on the village website.

the Bishopstone Housing Needs Survey. The draft report of the HNS had been received. There was a very high response rate - with half the village returning forms. This is much more than such surveys usually achieve. The Parish Council wishes to thank all those who took the time to respond. 73% of respondents considered that additional housing was necessary in the village and Wiltshire Council's analysis of the data indicated that 10 new homes for rent or low cost/shared ownership are required for people with a local connection. The report will be made available on the village website (if you don't have access to the internet a copy can be obtained by contacting me). The Parish Council agreed to remit the report to the Bishopstone Plan group to be taken into account in drafting the plan.

the "garden extensions" in The Styles. A draft lease has been received from Wiltshire Council for the leasing of this land to the Parish Council so that it can be sub-let as garden plots to villagers. Some points remained

to be negotiated but it was hoped to resolve matters quickly. Those who had expressed an interest in renting a plot were being contacted.

council tax. A budget for 2014/15 was agreed, with a precept similar to that in 2013/14. This should mean no increase in Council Tax so far as spending by Bishopstone Parish Council is concerned.

Have your say about the future of the village

HIGHWAYS, TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT

Very briefly, the Bishopstone Plan is a vision of the village in 5 or 10 years from now, as seen by the community. The output will be a series of realistic actions to achieve what you, the people, want to see. Because your view will include things you wish to remain untouched and things you expect to be conserved as well as areas of improvement or development then the output will include some "inaction" too.

Every month we are asking for your views on a particular set of issues. This month it is "highways, traffic and transport" that deserves your attention. What should be included in our plan in order to ensure that we have safe, efficient and convenient means of transport, that highways in the village are properly maintained and that villagers and visitors continue to enjoy ready access to the area's many footpaths and bridleways?

- What policies do we want in our plan to influence the various bodies responsible for the maintenance of highways and verges? What arrangements might be set up in the village to deal with the effects of extreme weather on accessibility?
- Steps are already being taken to persuade Wiltshire Council to reduce speed limits on the High Road/Broad Chalke Road. What further evidence can the plan set out to reinforce the message? Should more be done to enforce speed limits? Should we set up a Community Speedwatch?
- What changes should the plan seek to the bus service in the village? Should there be more effort to promote "community transport" for the elderly or the young? Could there be an equivalent of the "Chalke Valley Link" scheme but for other purposes?
- What policies do we want on the maintenance and improvement of footpaths and bridleways? Information is available on the village website on walks around the village. Should these be promoted more? Should we seek to establish an "Ebble Way" route through the Chalke Valley?

Is there a need for cycleways? How can the High Road be made safer for cyclists?

Thank you in advance for giving these subjects some thought. If you have something to say then there are several channels. An email to bishopstoneplan@btinternet.com or a sheet of paper posted in the collection box at the Church, Village Hall or The White Hart; or pop it through the front door of 18 The Croft, Harvest Lane. Your postcode is very helpful to us, your name adds weight to our analysis and we group the responses by age group - [0-15] [16-25] [26-40] [41-65] [65+] – but your reply is the most important.

Footnote: if you have already responded but now have more to say then please write again, there is no limit to the submissions.

BISHOPSTONE ARCHIVE

The Bishopstone Archive comprises a collection of photographs, maps, drawings and written notes illustrating the history of the village.

THE REVEREND GEORGE AUGUSTUS MONTGOMERY 1793-1842

George Montgomery was rector to St John the Baptist, Bishopstone 1821-1842. He had a colourful past history, as the illegitimate grandson of 10th Earl of Pembroke. The Earl had a relationship with Kitty Hunter, an MP's daughter. They eloped together, he disguised himself dressed up in a sailor's habit and black wig, and the couple fled the country. Kitty's father refused to take her back, so the couple wandered around the continent. After Kitty's baby was born in 1762, Lady Pembroke took her husband back, although he continued his profligate lifestyle. The baby, named Augustus, had to contend with the surname Reebkomp (an anagram of Pembroke) and a second Christian name Retnuh (his mother's name spelled backwards). This was our Rev Montgomery's father. Reebkomp lived with the Pembrokes at Wilton House. Kitty and Pembroke split up soon afterwards and she went off to live with the 3rd Earl of Bristol.

Meanwhile Augustus Retnuh Reebkomp was packed off to Eton aged 5. He must have been teased about his ridiculous names, but not about his illegitimacy which was quite common at Eton. The Pembroke family were fond of Augustus and he was happy at Wilton. At the age of 10 he joined the Navy as a 'captain's servant'.

He had long been promised by his father that he could drop his absurd surname, but Lady Pembroke was adamant that her husband's illegitimate children wouldn't share the name Pembroke. After much dispute they settled on Montgomery, another of Lord Pembroke's titles.

In 1791 Augustus married Susan Maltass who came from Smyrna. The Pembrokes despised her and called her 'Miss Smyrna'. Our rector, George Augustus Montgomery, was born in 1793. His father died when he was only 4. Little is known about their mother, and it is assumed that he and his younger sister, Elizabeth, were mainly brought up at Wilton by their half-uncle George, 11th Earl of Pembroke. We don't know where he was educated, but he was at Oriel College, Oxford.

George Montgomery was ordained and destined for the rich living of Bishopstone, which was in the Earl's gift. His annual income from the church averaged £806 a year in 1824, which was apart from his personal wealth. His wife, Cecilia, daughter of Dr George Markham, Dean of York, so Montgomery seemed set for a successful career in the church. Pembroke wrote to Montgomery's sister Elizabeth in 1822:

I must say George has a great deal of merit and promises to make a very good parish priest. He has an unhappy flock to deal with, an ill-built house, and like everybody else a diminishing income, but I perceive in him qualities which I think will enable him to cope with all difficulties and to enjoy all advantages.

His fatal expedition occurred on 1 December 1842 when Montgomery went to look over the church being built at East Grafton near Great Bedwyn. As he walked from the chancel to the nave to look at the new vaulting, a mass of stonework fell on him and he was killed instantly.

He was a benevolent rector, donating many items to the church, notably the pulpit, lectern, reredos and backs of pews in the chancel. He also set up the Montgomery Coal Fund to help the poor.

Pugin was commissioned to design and erect Montgomery's tomb in our church in the South Transept.

I hope the current clergy don't think of us as an unhappy flock to deal with!

Wiltshire's rivers need your help

Around England, rivers are under attack from invasive plants which are not native to these islands. Locally, rivers such as the Wylye, Nadder, Ebble and Avon suffer due to species such as Himalayan balsam, Japanese knotweed and giant hogweed. The impact on our native plants and animals, such as water vole, can be devastating.

Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, in partnership with Dorset and Hampshire Wildlife Trusts, tackle the fight against invasive species with the Source to Sea project. Funded by the Environment Agency, the team works with volunteers along the river Avon and its tributaries to eradicate these destructive species so that the wildlife that lives along our waterways can thrive.

This spring, the team will be coming to your area. Headed by project manager, Sam Stork, the team will work with local landowners, farmers, angling clubs and other interested parties to identify affected areas and, with the help of an army of volunteers, they will help to ensure that your part of the river is protected.

And that's where you come in - Source to Sea needs your help:

Can you help identify areas where invasive species are threatening local wildlife? To find out what to look for visit www.wiltshirewildlife.org and click on *What We Do – Protecting Wiltshire's Rivers*. Report your sightings using the feedback form. Can you volunteer your time to help clean up the river? Tackling invasive species along our rivers is a massive task and we need your help! We provide everything you need to participate in a volunteer day on the river.

We print a warning on the right hand side of the script to tell you when a review is due so that you have time to arrange an appointment with a doctor. Our new clinical computer system has an option which will prevent the dispensers from issuing repeat medication once the review date has passed and we have switched this on to safeguard you. Please make sure that you check when your medication review is due and make an appointment to see a doctor before your medication runs out.

Text Reminders

Are you concerned about forgetting an appointment? If so, why not sign up to receive text reminders?

When you make an appointment, you will be sent a confirmation message so that you can check that we have understood when you think the appointment is. Then 24 hours before your appointment you will receive another text to remind you about it. Please see the Receptionist the next time you visit the Surgery or telephone us during Surgery hours.

Online reordering

An increasing number of people are making use of the internet to order repeat medication via a secure website, allowing them to do so from the relative comfort of their own home and at a time that suits them. The process is quite straightforward.






