Hello from the Revd Jenny Taylor Two weeks ago I was 2260 miles away from the Chalke Valley, staying in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee. I was part of the 60 strong Diocesan Pilgrimage led by Bishop Nicholas Holtam. We began in Jerusalem, spending six nights in a hotel just outside the old city walls and then travelling north to Galilee where we stayed for 6 more nights. Our itin-

erary was packed full of many intense experiences including praying at the Wailing Wall, following the Way of the Cross and then visiting Bethlehem. We spent time in the desert around Masada and then floated our cares away in the Dead Sea!

It was a hugely memorable fortnight, interspersed as it was with times of praying and singing together, celebrating the Eucharist and hearing passages from the Bible actually in context. Obviously our experiences were coloured by the political situation and learning more about and seeing at first hand the plight of the Palestinian Christians was deeply shocking.

There was much weeping and much laughter (especially the latter from me on top of a camel in a car park in Jericho!) and it will take some time before all the memories and experiences have been processed. But one thing is for sure, I feel strengthened and renewed by our time there and also more than ever, realise what a precious gift we have been given in our faith. Wherever we are, whatever our circumstances, whoever we are, God is with us and has given us his love in Jesus Christ which we must not keep to ourselves but willingly share with others through our words, our actions and our lives.



#### COURSES FOR THE AUTUMN SEASON IN BISHOPSTONE VILLAGE HALL

Two six-week courses from WEA will begin in autumn.

<u>"Wiltshire's Industrial Heritage"</u> tutor Peter Stanier. (WEA course number C3525446) Rural Wiltshire has a remarkable variety of past industries, and such evidence also complements local history. Topics will include stone and iron working, limekilns, wind and water mills, textiles, roads, canals and railways. This illustrated course by popular lecturer Peter Stanier starts on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2 - 4.15pm, for 6 weeks, ending 3rd November. No class on 27<sup>th</sup> October (half term). Fee for 6 weeks - £53.

<u>"Stained Glass"</u> tutor Susan Smith. (WEA course number C3525449) This illustrated course will explore and explain painting on glass, and among other things discuss medieval treasures, the Victorian Gothic revival and the beauty of ancient and modern glass in our churches. Susan Smith is an expert in this area, and is involved with the NADFAS church recording of our own church of St John the Baptist in Bishopstone. The course begins on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2 - 4.15pm, for six weeks, ending on 9<sup>th</sup> December. Fee for 6 weeks - £53.

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

The Parish is already benefiting from the Footpath Improvement Programme of Wiltshire Council's South West Area Board.



A new kissing gate has replaced the stile at the eastern end of Mac's Meadow.



The footpath beside Raglands has been reinstated on its correct alignment.

The next project is to replace two stiles with kissing gates at the Faulston end of the footpath to Croucheston. These gates will be of a new, all wooden, design – more appropriate to the rural setting.

The work at Mac's Meadow and Raglands was undertaken by Rights of Way Officers, assisted by members of South Wilts Ramblers. The new project will only happen if we can assemble a working party from the village. If we can get sufficient people this only means giving up a few hours to help. All the materials and equipment are supplied by the Rights of Way Team. It is likely that this work will happen in early September.

If you are prepared to give up some time to help can you please let me know as soon as possible. Once I have a list of people we will find a date that the majority can make.

# PARISH COUNCIL

#### Temporary Closure of the High Road

The main road through the village (the C12) will be subject to temporary closure for two days in the period following 20<sup>th</sup> July 2014 so that Wiltshire Council contractors can undertake carriageway resurfacing and associated works. The statutory notice says that "access will be maintained for residents and businesses although delays are likely due to the nature of the works". At the time of writing it is unclear whether the bus service will be maintained or precisely when the work will begin (likely to be 21st July). Any updates on this will be posted on the village website (www.bishopstonesalisbury.co.uk).

#### **Closure of Mill Lane**

Wiltshire Council has now completed the removal of the trees that were blown down in Mill Lane. The extent of the damage to the road can be seen in the photo.



It is likely to be some weeks before consultations are completed with the Environment Agency and work can begin to rebuild the riverbank and the road. In the meantime the road will remain closed. Mill Lane should be used only for access to properties and then only from the Faulstone end.


Any dry, tinned or biscuit food is acceptable but they are always short of the following:-





This is a great achievement which reflects the tremendous community spirit that exists in the Chalke Valley – from the 600 or so people who originally bought shares in, or donated money to, the venture to the 100 or more volunteers who have planned, project-managed, provided practical help or who serve behind the counter in the Stores or Coffee Shop – and to the URC congregation for so generously agreeing to share their iconic chapel building for the greater good of the whole community.

The more successful the Hub becomes, the more volunteers are needed both on the Committee and behind the counters – and as you will see from the article and pictures in the centre spread, volunteers clearly find this a rewarding and enjoyable experience.

All this stemmed from the Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire and Village Meetings held last year. Now that we have saved – resoundingly – our Shop and Post Office, the authors of the Neighbourhood Plan are now addressing the other issues of concern to villagers i.e. protecting our natural environment, controlling the quantity and quality of our built environment, creating employment and affordable housing for those who could not otherwise afford to stay in the village. 




