#### BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be at 8.00pm on Thursday 13 March 2014 in the Village Hall. All are welcome to attend.

The meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> February to discuss an Emergency Plan for the village was well attended (see report elsewhere in this STaB). The Parish Council will be considering next steps, in particular how to take forward action to deal with some of the causes of flooding in the parish.

At the request of Wiltshire's South West Area Board the Parish Council has undertaken an audit of the state of all 41 footpaths, bridleways and byways in the parish, noting missing sign posts, blockages, broken stiles etc. It is hoped that SWWAB will make money available for repairs and improvements. The Parish Council is very grateful to all those who helped undertake this audit.

The Parish Council has made a submission to the SWWAB on the need for lower speed limits on some of the village roads. The meeting on 13 March will consider the provision of additional grit/salt bins to be located where side roads meet the High Road.

On 27 February the SWWAB launched a project to establish a "Discover Chalke Valley" website which will give guidance to both residents and visitors about attractions and events in our area.

The White Hart pub has now been added to Wiltshire Council's list of Assets of Community Value (see February's STaB).

The meeting will hear reports from a variety of village organisations on what has been achieved over the past 12 months and on plans for the future.

It is also proposed to discuss what more can be done to encourage greater "community spirit" in the village. The floods revealed again the need for more voluntary action to support those who cannot help themselves. Cuts in services mean that we have to do more for ourselves - we cannot rely on "them" to do it for us - how can we best organize for this?



#### **EMERGENCY PLAN MEETING**

A special village meeting was held on Monday 10th February to present the Village Emergency Plan. This was very well attended and supported by over 60 people.

The form of the Emergency Response Plan for the village was presented and discussed. It is hoped to be able to release the plan to the newly formed Community Response Group, made up of the Area Representatives from the village, within a few days. The emergencies already considered are flooding, snow and ice and blocked roads. Further sections to include utility failures, will be added later.

The Area Representatives are still to be confirmed and will be announced in the April issue of STAB.

The meeting did not consider any retrospective plans to improve drainage. The Parish Council will take this up as a separate project with landowners and the public authorities concerned.

The Parish Council is delighted with the interest and support shown in this plan, and most grateful to Roger Stockton for taking on this task.

#### THE BISHOPSTONE PLAN

#### A Shared Vision for the Future of Bishopstone Village

Village life is a wonderful thing, something to be appreciated and preserved. Its quality is very much dependent on the efforts of those that live here. The Bishopstone Plan will be both a record of the features that contribute to the character of our village and an action plan for what you feel should be changed or protected in the future. Local government is committed to taking into account the needs and concerns of local residents when planning and formulating policy. This Plan will be one tool by which we can all participate in and influence this process.

So it's important that we get everyone's views, including the people who feel they are in a minority. Not all of us are fit and well, car-owning, computer-literate, or have active and fulfilling social lives. On the other hand, there are many who are leading very busy lives with no time to stop and think about how they would like to see Bishopstone evolve in the coming years.

Between now and the early summer we shall still be asking for your input. The results of the council's Rural Housing Needs Survey have been passed to our Steering Group to take account of it. We still welcome comments about housing development but this Plan is emphatically not just about housing.

Over recent months we have raised many headings through the pages of STaB without naming the issues. We are keen to know if you are concerned or indifferent about the amenities in this village, about the services provided or missing, about all aspects of the landscape and environment, about roads-paths-traffic-transport and about community life. It is the issues that we want to air. Solutions and actions come later. Maybe there are things about this village and its people that you want to enthuse about. Great, because our Plan is about conserving the best. Perhaps you want to have a good moan about something. We'd like to hear that too because this Plan should result in improvements.

If you have something to say then there are several channels. An email to

<u>bishopstoneplan@btinternet.com</u> or a sheet of paper posted in the collection box at the Church, Village Hall or The White Hart; or pop it through the front door of 18 The Croft, Harvest Lane. Your postcode is very helpful to us, your name adds weight to our analysis and we group the responses by age group - [0-15] [16-25] [26-40] [41-65] [65+] – but your reply is the most important.

#### Ivy the Guide Dog update

We have now received the 8 month report for Ivy, our sponsored Guide Dog puppy. The skills she learns this year will form the foundations for the guiding work that she will start to do when she leaves her puppy trainer and moves to one of the National Training Schools to begin her formal training. She is progressing quite normally and responding well to being handled, and commands like 'sit', 'down' 'come' 'wait' etc. She mixes well with other dogs and travels well on public transport and in the car, and behaves well in cafes/restaurants. She is now able to be left on her own for up to 3 hours a day without any problems. Her confidence in busy town areas and in unusual situations is not quite as good as it could be , but it is developing well.

It is hard to believe that Ivy is now 8 months old, and it is most encouraging to receive these regular reports and know that she is doing well, and we look forward to another progress report in a couple of months time.






