BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting on 11th September

The main subject for discussion at the meeting of the Parish Council on 11th September was the planning application for the proposed refurbishment and conversion of Faulston Barns into six dwellings. Several villagers who had submitted comments to Wiltshire Council were present. There was not unanimous support for the proposal, with some Councillors preferring a smaller number of housing units. However, the Parish Council, by a majority, resolved to support the application, subject to conditions. The barns are now in an advanced state of dilapidation and are potentially dangerous structures. The Parish Council was therefore prepared to support an alternative use for the buildings so long as their essential character is retained. It was felt that the current proposals broadly achieved that.

However, the Parish Council accepted that the proposals raised concerns as regards traffic impacts, flooding and the safeguarding of wildlife and public rights of way. These concerns have been included in the response to Wiltshire Council. Full details are contained in the minutes of the meeting which are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk).

Matters raised by members of the public included:

- the deteriorating state of the surface of the new car park at Whitlock Rise. Cllr Jose Green of Wiltshire Council undertook to raise this with the officers concerned.
- concern that some of the "super" cars which paraded through the village on 10th August had not stuck to the undertaking not to exceed the speed limit. The Council decided to take this up with the organisers of the event.
- the need for a campaign to encourage the many cyclists who use the valley road to wear high visibility clothing. It was suggested that this might be something to be taken up with the South West Wiltshire Area Board.

Other matters discussed at the meeting included:

- the need for speed limits on the village roads. It was agreed to respond to Wiltshire Council asking those concerned to reconsider their recent decision not to extend the 30mph speed limit on the C12 and to make the case, again, for limits on the village roads, particularly Harvest and Faulston Lanes.
- the latest report for the Emergency Planning Co-ordinator (Roger Stockton). Details are on the website (also see article in this STaB).
- the problem of the recent spate of vandalism in the children's play area and elsewhere in the village (see last STaB). The Chairman, Major Thompson, appealed to parents to ensure that children respected public as well as private property and for anyone with information as to who might have been involved to come forward.

Next Parish Council Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on **Thursday 13th November at 7.30pm** in the Village Hall. Tea and coffee will be available from 7.15pm. All are welcome to attend.

BISHOPSTONE EMERGENCY PLANNING REPORT



We are slowly approaching the winter months and it makes sense for us to review the village's Emergency Planning.

I am delighted to report that many areas of the river have been cleared after polite reminders to landowners with riparian responsibilities. In particular, large areas of bank below Faulston Bridge have been cleared and the river flow improved and there has been extensive clearance on the river below Church Lane.

I would ask you to note, however, that weed clearance has caused problems when large amounts of cut weed have been allowed to drift down the river rather than being removed. All this does is create blockages down stream that someone else has to clear.

Nevertheless, there is still work to be done. There is a possibility, to be discussed at a Parish Council meeting, that the sluice by the Triangle be restored. This might help water flow and drainage to the north of The Wilderness.

We are still awaiting two major actions by Wiltshire Council. The first is work on Crouchston Drove and the second is the restoration of the riverbank and road in Mill Lane. Both of these have been outstanding for many months and the Parish Council are continuing to press Wiltshire Council to implement the necessary work before the coming winter. Residents will be informed of developments.

Some drains in Netton Street have been cleared but some that the Highways Division promised would be cleared were not done. The Parish Council is continuing to pursue this issue.

We are still awaiting sand and sandbags from Wiltshire Council. These will be stored at two points in the village in Throope and in Crouchston. It needs to be understood that these are Parish stores and will be controlled by the Flood Wardens (Chris Sexton and Richard Tory). ***They are not a self-help or a help yourself store but are intended for issue to those most at risk of having their house flooded and who are elderly or vulnerable.*** If you consider yourself in this category it is likely that your property will be on the "At Risk Register" within the Village Emergency Plan. These properties were highlighted in the Emergency Planning meeting earlier in the year. If you are in doubt please contact me.

While I know that several properties have made efforts to prepare themselves for a repeat of the flooding by taking preventative action them-selves. I would remind everyone again that it is NOT the responsibility of the Parish Council to provide protection to individual houses

As in previous years, the Parish Council have ordered an additional one tonne bag salt bag for supplementary gritting of High Road junctions and village roads in the event of icy conditions. Ali Thorne is undertaking training in the use of tailgate spreaders (which are attached to the back of a 4x4 or other suitable vehicle) being provided by the South West Wiltshire Area Board to work in tandem with the main gritting lorries.

Finally, work is going on to have the Village Hall designated as an Emergency Rest Centre for the population in the event of any form of local disaster. Wiltshire Council will provide staff and supplies to enact this capability.

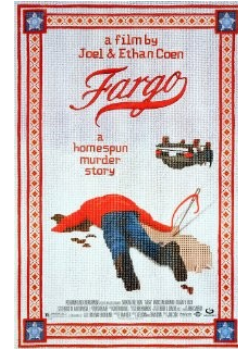
THE BISHOPSTONE MAGIC LANTERN SOCIETY

Smokestop

At the beginning of July, the Village Hall Trustees had to submit their End of Year 3 Report to the Big Lottery Fund (BLF). This report summarized all that had been achieved in the three years since completion of the refurbishment of the hall and aimed to prove that we had met all our Outcomes and Milestones, the targets that prove the success or otherwise of the project.

The significance of the report was that it was the final return to BLF that enabled them to adjudge how successful the project had been.

I am delighted to be able to report that the report was accepted and the BLF gave us great credit for the way the project had been run and administered.
