Hello from the Revd Jenny Taylor At the beginning of August we marked the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War. We held a service in Church which was well attended and appreciated. I think each one of us came away from them moved by the heroism

and the sacrifice made by so many unknown and unsung men and women. Those of you who came will have noticed our nave altar with which we have been experimenting for almost a year. The PCC now has to decide whether to keep it or remove it and we will be having a parish discussion after the service on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> September. Do please join us if you would like the PCC to take your views into account.

Since the beginning of August we seem to have received increasingly worse news from around the world – the carnage, brutality and futility continues in Gaza, in Israel, in Iraq to name but three war zones. Madeleine Albright, the former United States Secretary of State, has just been quoted as saying "the world is in a mess". A statement that is true enough and one that engenders all sorts of reactions – emotional and political.

As September dawns, the time of new beginnings for children and young people, we can **all** begin afresh with our commitment to peace – the Commemoration Service last month contained words (words which, inceidentally, have been and will be used in services up and down the United Kingdom) which committed us to strengthen our efforts in our families, in our communities in our world. Why not make them our own commitment as school and university terms begin, as efforts continue to appoint our new Rector, as God continues to use us to grow His Kingdom in our Valley.

### The Commitment to Peace

Let us pledge ourselves today to live as good neighbours, to honour the past, to care for all who are in need, and to live at peace among ourselves and with all people.

Lord God, Father of all, we pledge ourselves to serve you and this neighbourhood, to bring relief to all who are in need, and comfort to the sad, lonely, and distressed; Keep us ever mindful of the struggles and achievements of former generations, and of this place where we make our home, now, and in the days to come. Amen.



#### Notes from the Parochial Church Council and the Friends of the Church – September 2014

Both the PCC and the Friends of the Church held their AGMs recently, and there is quite a lot happening over the next few months in the church. As our church is about 800 years old, the building needs repairs from time to time, and this is now such a time!!

There are extensive plans for repairs and improvements to the church over the next few years, after the latest quinquennial inspection of the fabric of the building. It is old, so the repairs will cost money, and grants are being applied for. Work has already been done to the outer face of the north wall of the nave and the roof. Studies will go on to improve the heating, for the better comfort of both congregation and priest!

At their AGM, the Friends of the Church elected Chris Sexton as Chairman. Many thanks are due to David Leaver for all he has done for the Friends in so many committee posts over many years. His wise counsel as Chairman will be missed, but he remains on the committee where his advice will always be welcome

The nave altar has caused much discussion and this will continue until the service on 28<sup>th</sup> September. After the service there will be a discussion about the future position of the altar in the church. Meanwhile, the host and wine will now be consecrated at the nave altar, and then processed to the high altar, where the congregation will come to receive communion.

The Service of Commemoration for the start of the First World War was very well supported and a great occasion in our church. We are all very grateful to Jenny Taylor for the wonderful tone of reflection and remembrance in such an uplifting service, as we remembered all those from Bishopstone who gave their lives, and also those who returned home at the end of their service. The singing under Olive Moody, the music by Richard Seal, and the readings given with such feeling all made the service a truly village occasion. As always, the PCC is very grateful for the cleaning and the flowers which complete the look of a loved and well supported church.

# BISHOPSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

#### Meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> July

At the meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> July there was a further presentation regarding the proposed redevelopment of Faulston Barns. The developers said that after consideration it had been decided to divide the substantial floor area into only 6 residential units. There would be no change to the "footprint" of the building and changes to the exterior walls would be kept to a minimum, with doors and windows, wherever possible, inserted into existing openings in the structure. Sustainable drainage, rainwater recycling etc would be a feature.

A planning application has now been submitted and will be discussed at the next meeting of the Parish Council. Details of the application are available on the village website (www.bishopstone-salisbury.co.uk) and will be displayed in the village hall (can be seen during Coffee Mornings).

Other matters discussed at the meeting included:

- the upkeep of footpaths and drainage channels;
- the need for additional signs encouraging dog walkers to clear up after their pets;
- the final decision by Wiltshire Council to make no change to speed limits along the C12 in the village;
- the outcome of a meeting with Wiltshire Council about next steps following the Housing Needs Survey.

The full minutes of the meeting are available on the village website or from me.

#### Lack of volunteers

In the last edition of STaB I called for volunteers to help install two kissing gates to replace stiles on the footpath from Faulston to Croucheston. I received a couple of offers of help (thank you to them), but not enough to make the job viable. As with a number of other services the days when this sort of thing was done by the local authority are largely gone. If we want to improve our footpaths, making them more accessible to walkers who, for example, may have difficulty scrambling over a high stile, then we have got to do it ourselves. Wiltshire Council will provide supervision, materials and tools. There is one further chance we can arrange this



with the Rights of Way Officer. So can I have some further volunteers by 12 September <u>please</u>.

#### Local Crime Reports - Wilton Rural NPT – July 2014

#### **Barford St Martin**
